


Departmental Budget Impact

Budget per Capita





Trauma Informed Care SPA

\$180,000: Down from \$250,000 due to carryover funding. The program began full operations in mid-2015. The Health, Fire and Police Departments and the school district are working in conjunction with the County to assist youth who witnessed violence.

Homicide Review Commission

In conjunction with the Office of Violence Prevention, in 2015 the Homicide Review Commission focused its attention on studying the perspectives of city youth on possible solutions for crime reduction.

Youth Violence Initiative

To support this new mayoral initiative, 2 positions have been created in the Office of Violence Prevention. These positions will focus on strengthening community relations and develop a youth violence reduction plan.

Infant Mortality

Overall, the city's infant mortality rate has been reduced. Hispanic and non-Hispanic White rates are below 5 per 1,000 live births. However, the rate for African-Americans has gradually increased since 2008, remaining above 14.
