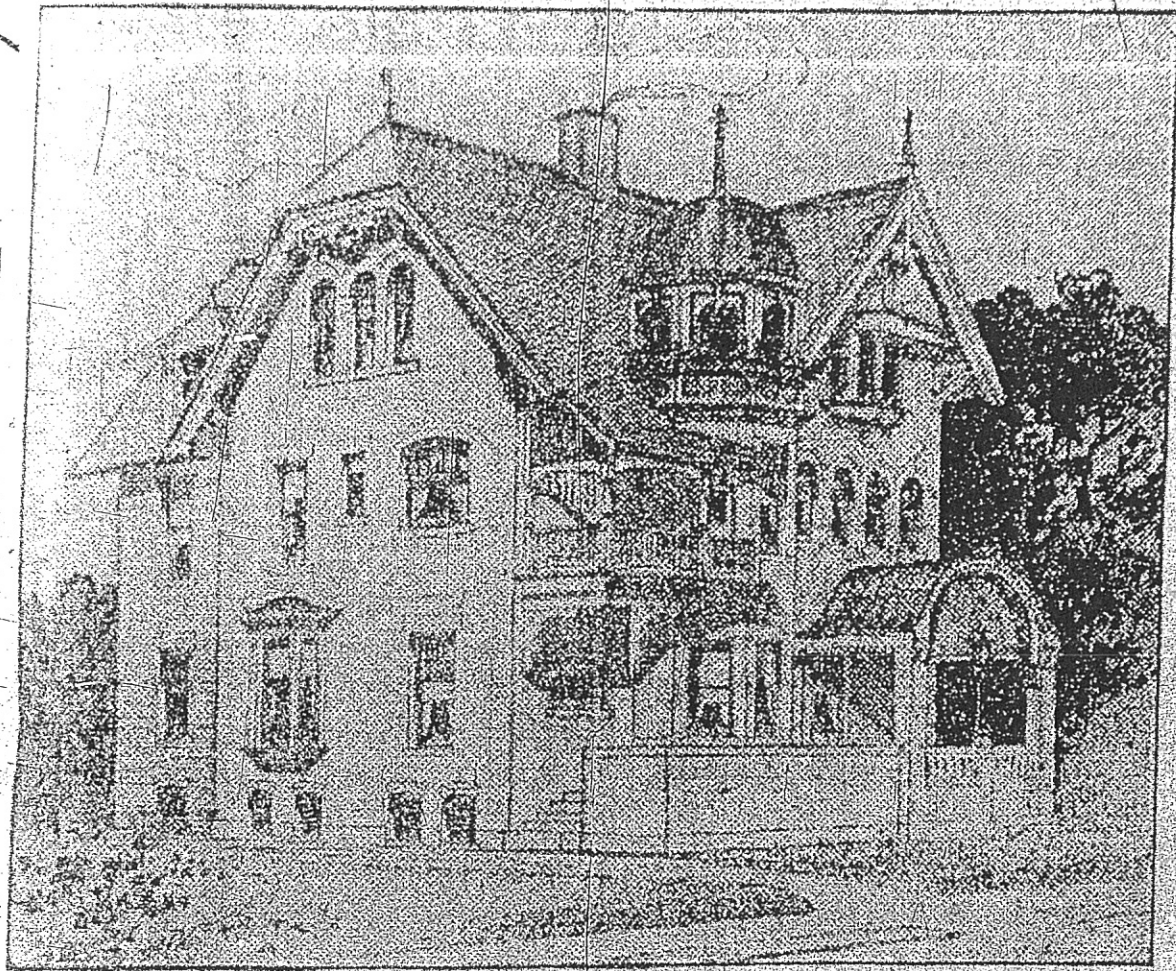

**DR. J. A. BACH'S LAKE FRONT HOME**

(Residence on Wall Avenue, just north of Gilman Street, overlooking the lake. Will cost \$12,000.)

**A \$12,000 Residence for Dr. Bach.**

Dr. James A. Bach has begun the erection of a residence on Wall avenue, just north of Gilman street, which will be one of the handsomest houses, as well as one of the most comfortable, to be found along the lake front in that part of the city. The plans are in the hands of Carl Barkhausen, architect, and the home complete will cost \$12,000. It will be ready for occupancy by May 1, 1903. It will be brick veneered, with stone foundation, the brick to be used being red sand brick with black headers; porch with an ornamental curved roof of copper with copper trimmings will grace the front, and the front of the home will command a fine view of the lake and Milwaukee bay. The building will be 36 by 40 feet in dimensions, and on the first story will be a large entrance hall with broad staircase, and the remainder of the front will be taken up with a drawing room, 15 by 28 feet, with a large artistic fireplace in the center with permanent seats near it. A large elevated bay window near the fireplace will overlook the lake. This room will be finished in early light mahogany stained. The dining room back of this will be finished in quarter sawed white oak stained like the

living room, a plate rack, etc. The kitchen will have all modern conveniences, and the second floor will be finished with four large bedrooms, a large library with permanent bookcases, a bath room, a shower bath, etc. On the third floor will be a sewing room with an oriel window looking toward the lake, a billiard room, servant's room, etc., all to be completely finished and plastered.

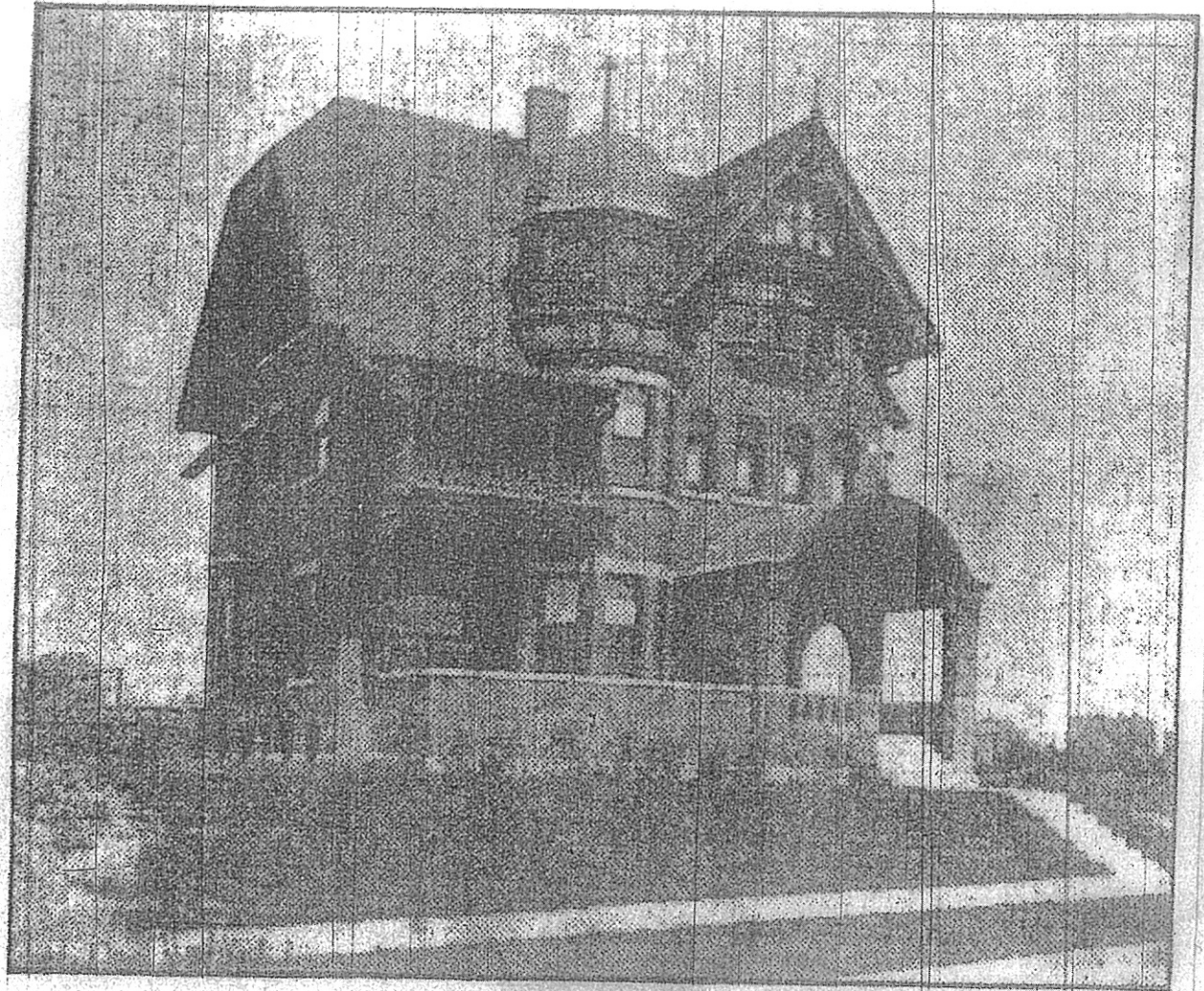

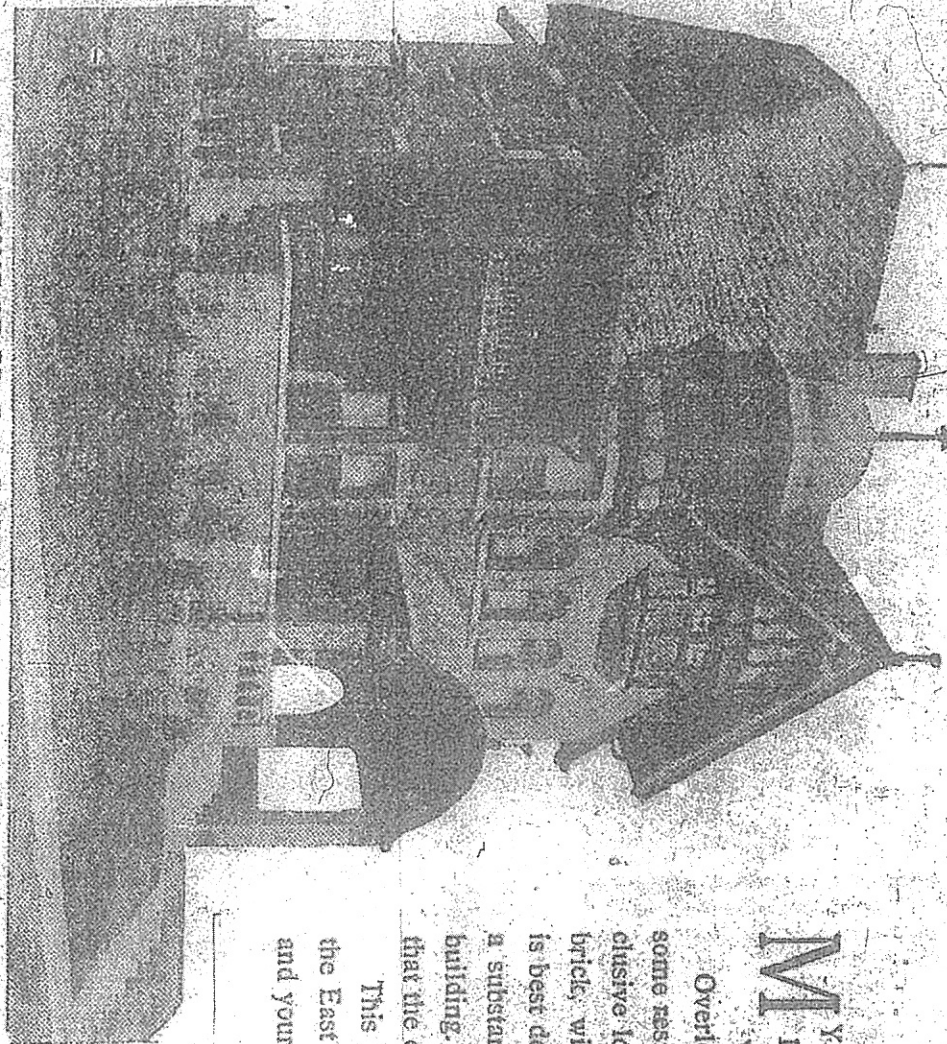

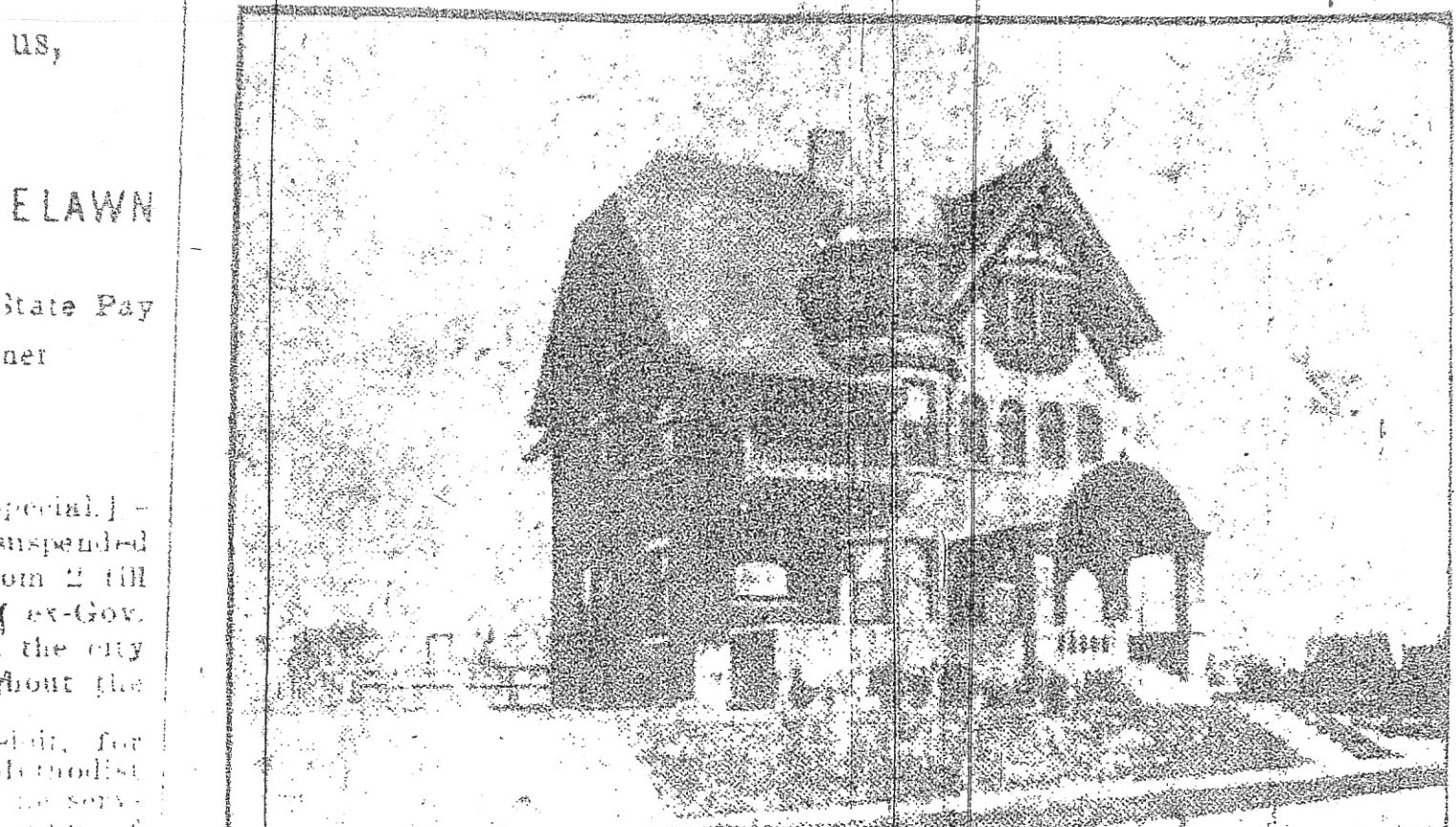

## RESIDENCE OF DR. BACH, WAHL AVENUE.

Dr. James Bach's residence at 565 Wahl avenue, one of the new homes of the Eighteenth ward, is an example of what is known as Austrian renaissance in architecture. It is a handsome building made of St. Louis pressed brick, three stories high. On the first floor are a hall, general living room, dining room, kitchen and back halls for the two entrances at the west, and on the second floor are four

bedrooms and a library. On the third floor are servants' quarters, sewing room and a billiard room.

The first floor is finished in curly birch and mahogany and quarter-sawed oak. The house has the advantage of fine location, being situated on a lot with a frontage of 110 feet on Wahl avenue, extending back to Terrace avenue, and overlooking Lake Michigan. Fred Barkhausen drew the plans.
