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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	(All City Personnel were duly affirmed)
3	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: In the 6th District,
4	Anzell Bratcher, Agent for ABC Liquors #2,
5	Incorporated, Class A Liquor and Malt Application for
6	ABC Liquors #2 at 205 East North Avenue.
7	MS. BARRON: Mr. Chairman, the applicant
8	withdrew his application late yesterday afternoon. We
9	attempted to contact any neighbors to advise them.
10	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Are there any people
11	here to testify on this matter, it would be 205 East
12	North Avenue? Do you understand that the application
13	has been withdrawn?
14	ALDERMAN McGEE: I just had a question as to
15	when would this license be renewed or when does it
16	expire?
17	MS. BARRON: The current license?
18	ALDERMAN McGEE: Yes.
19	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Can I see a show of
20	hands, once again, who's here to testify on 205 East
21	North Avenue. Could you come forth. Even though the
22	application has been withdrawn, we'd like to get your
23	testimony on the record, because that application
24	could be resubmitted at some point in the near future.
25	Could you both raise your right hands and be sworn in,

00003 1 please. 2 (Whereupon, speakers were duly affirmed.) 3 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Sir, your name and 4 address for the record first. 5 MR. WOGSLAND: Stuart Wogsland, 2133 North 6 Hubbard Street. 7 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And how far away do you 8 live from this location? 9 MR. WOGSLAND: About a block-and-a-half, if 10 that. 11 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Your testimony? 12 MR. WOGSLAND: I've lived in the 13 neighborhood now for the last two-and-a-half years, 14 and I'm coming from Shorewood that has been a little 15 bit different, but Brewer's Hill has been an up and 16 coming area, and that would be a wonderful area to 17 actually live and actually own a duplex in that area. 18 Unfortunately, with ABC Liquor we've noticed a lot of 19 prostitution problems in front of there, drug 20 activity, and crime there. We understand the man 21 needs to make a living by having a business there, but 22 in that community it doesn't seem to fit. 23 In addition to that, St. Marcus also opened 24 up a school, a choice school, right across the street 25 from there. I don't think that's socially responsible

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1	on their part to possibly have a liquor store that
2	near to where our children are growing up.
3	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Thank you. Stuart, so
4	the place currently has a license, they currently sell
5	alcohol?
6	MR. WOGSLAND: Correct. I've actually been
7	in there, too. It looks like it caters to it's all
8	bulletproof glass in there, a steel door basically to
9	pass through your alcohol, and I don't know if that's
10	what we really want in our neighborhood, but I
11	understand the safety of their employees.
12	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: So this would be a new
13	application taking over an existing location?
14	MS. BARRON: That's correct. And the
15	existing license expires on April 19th, 2006.
16	MR. WOGSLAND: Another thing we have noticed
17	there is multiple loitering during after-school hours,
18	weekends, that type of stuff. There is a rooming
19	house, also, upstairs there where I believe a gentleman
20	that owns the business actually does rent out rooms up
21	there. We don't know if that's part of the problem
22	with the clientele, but it's something that I
23	don't like getting approached at 6:00 in the morning
24	by a prostitute by a business asking if I'm looking
25	for something or at 1:00 in the morning basically when

00005 1 I'm coming home from a friend's house. I've called 2 the police department numerous times when I've seen that type of stuff, and that's why we're here. 3 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Thank you very much. 4 5 Any questions of this witness? Okay, sir. Your name 6 and address for the record? 7 MR. ROFFERS: Larry Roffers, 2023 North 8 Palmer. I live about two-and-a-half blocks from the 9 liquor store. 10 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: And your testimony? 11 MR. ROFFERS: It is a problem area. A lot 12 of North Avenue towards Holton is a bad area, but the 13 liquor store tends to draw prostitutes regularly, and 14 it's every day. There's drug dealings going on, and 15 there's drug people staggering to and from the store, 16 urinating in the bushes behind the store. It's just 17 not a good thing. 18 I don't object to the liquor store. If it 19 was a decent liquor store, I would patronize it, but 20 he's not responsible for what's going on outside of 21 his store, and I think he needs to be --22 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Thank you. Questions 23 by members of the committee? Sir, your name and 24 addresses for the record, please? 25 MR. PAYNE: Alexander Payne, 2333 North

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1	Palmer. I've been living there since 1980.
2	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: How far away are you
3	from this location?
4	MR. PAYNE: Half a block.
5	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: What is your testimony,
6	Alexander?
7	MR. PAYNE: I don't have no complaint
8	against the liquor store. The previous owner before
9	he owned it, I had no problem with him either.
10	CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Any questions by
11	members of the committee? Is there anyone else in the
12	room here to testify to 205 East North Avenue?
13	Well, the application has been officially withdrawn,
14	but we appreciate you coming down, we appreciate your
15	testimony. The application could be resubmitted
16	tomorrow, so we want to let you know that your
17	testimony is part of the record in this hearing, and
18	we will keep it for future reference. Alderman McGee,
19	any comments?
20	ALDERMAN McGEE: I definitely want to say
21	that this location has become a problem in the
22	neighborhood for certain people who live in the
23	neighborhood. There have been some town hall
24	meetings at the church nearby, and the owner
25	apparently is looking forward to selling this

00007 1 location, and I think the attraction or the attractive 2 part of the negotiations must be that the potential 3 buyer would look into having a liquor store at the 4 location. And I know there's a potential applicant on 5 the horizon, and that potential applicant is going to 6 have to meet with the neighborhood and find out what's 7 really best for that neighborhood and look into the 8 concerns of neighborhood. 9 One thing I am go going to do is refer the 10 rooming house that's upstairs to the City Attorney's 11 Office to see if there can be an investigation as to 12 is this an illegal entity that's operating upstairs 13 from the tavern. 14 CHAIRMAN WITKOWIAK: Good idea. Thank you, 15 Alderman McGee. Thank you for your testimony. We 16 appreciate you appearing here today. 17 \* \* \*
