1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

Over the past several years, there has been an increase in firearm related violent crime in the City of Milwaukee. Much of this violence is focused within specific geographic areas of the city. Despite implementation of innovative strategies and the confiscation of illegal firearms, gun crime continues to pose a threat to public safety and has a significant impact on Milwaukee neighborhoods. In cooperation with the ATF and other federal partners, MPD established the Crime Gun Intelligence Center (CGIC), where investigators work together to identify offenders, link crime guns and casings for the apprehension and prosecution of gun offenders. In 2015, CGIC was only able to process 33% of crime guns. The goal of this grant is to expand our capacity with additional staff to increase our processing of crime guns to 100% and implement focused deterrence efforts to prevent and respond to firearm related violence.

2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

The mission of CGIC is to disrupt gun violence through consistent, timely production of actionable intelligence to apprehend and prosecute prolific gun offenders. CGIC plays an important role in the Violence Reduction Network (VRN) Initiative in the Center Street Corridor, a 2.3 square mile area on the north side of the city that contains 11% of firearm related violent crime.
