HVAC Maintenance Technician 4: Five years of full-time experience in the maintenance and repair of HVAC/refrigeration equipment and other mechanical, electrical and electronic automated building systems or an Associate Degree in the HVAC field and two years of experience in the maintenance

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and repair of HVAC/refrigeration equipment and other mechanical, electrical and electronic automated systems. Equivalencies considered.

HVAC Maintenance Technician 3: Three years of full-time experience in the maintenance and repair of HVAC/refrigeration equipment and other mechanical, electrical and electronic automated building systems or an Associate Degree in the HVAC field and two years of experience in the maintenance and repair of HVAC/refrigeration equipment and other mechanical, electrical and electronic automated systems. Equivalencies considered.

HVAC Maintenance Technician 2: Two years of full-time experience in the maintenance and repair of HVAC/refrigeration equipment and other mechanical, electrical and electronic automated building systems.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Ability to operate and program computers and work with various software and graphics utilized for facilities management throughout the Milwaukee Police Department.
- Mechanical ability with specialized knowledge of heating ,cooling and ventilating equipment involving centrifugal and reciprocating compressors, chillers, pneumatic, electrical and electronic controls and the additional ability to work with computerized building management systems. The Milwaukee Police Department currently utilizes the Trane Trace automation system.
- Knowledge of preventative maintenance programs.
- Ability to read and interpret blueprints, plans, sequence of operations and technical specifications.
- Be able to understand and follow oral and written instructions. Successfully manage multiple assignments through effective prioritization and time management.

iii. Certifications, Licenses, Registrations:

Hold a valid State of Wisconsin driver's license. Chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) certification is required. Valid boiler operator's license or higher classification stationary Engineers license in the City of Milwaukee (either high or low pressure) is desirable.

iv. Other Requirements:

Be in good physical condition and be able to lift and carry 50 pounds for long periods of time and 100 pounds for short periods. Be able to climb vertical ladders and/or scaffolding. Not be afraid of heights or confined and crawl spaces. Assist with regular and seasonal building and grounds tasks (i.e. snow removal, building winterization and Fall/Spring startups and shutdowns). Accept deliveries, make purchase, assist contractors and respond immediately to building maintenance emergencies. Monitor and operate building automation systems (Trane Ensemble) to control complex heating and cooling systems at efficient levels.
