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File # 070615 is a resolution relating to application, acceptance and funding of the Childhood Immunization Disparities Grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Background

- 1. This resolution authorizes the Milwaukee Health Department to apply for, accept and fund the Childhood Immunization Disparities grant project from the Federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
- 2. This is a continuing grant.

Discussion

- 1. The purposes of this project include reducing immunization disparities and increasing immunization rates. Immunization coverage rates for city of Milwaukee children are estimated to be nearly 30% less than that of Milwaukee County as a whole. A substantial immunization gap exists between races/ethnicities within the city. Based on data from the Wisconsin Immunization Registry, the immunization completion rate for African American children ages 19 to 35 months is 36% as compared to 52% for white children and 57% for Latino children.
- 2. The Healthy People 2010 objective for childhood immunization rates is 90%.
- 3. This funding will enable MHD to conduct citywide reminders, outreach to healthcare and childcare providers and provide medical assistance outreach.
- 4. This project further seeks to:
 - Implement provider education and evaluate the effectiveness in decreasing immunization errors and missed opportunities for immunization
 - Implement a set of community intervention activities
 - Develop sustainable interventions for reducing racial disparities in immunizations
- 5. This grant funding encompasses the period of September 30, 2007 through September 29, 2008.

Fiscal Effect

- 1. The total amount of this grant is \$300,000, entirely from the grantor. This is the same amount as was awarded for 2006-2007.
- 2. 75% of this grant (\$224,740) will fund the following existing positions in MHD with salary and fringe benefits: 1 FTE Health Information Specialist (SG 593); 0.5 FTE Office Assistant II (SG 410); and 1.75 FTE Public Health Nurse (SG 666)
- 3. Supplies, materials and services are budgeted at \$51,400. \$13,000 of this amount has been budgeted for incentives for program participants.
- 4. Contractual services, intern services, physician services and consulting are budgeted at \$23,860, approximately \$10,000 less than in 2006.

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
