There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. It is the intention of the Common Council to suspend or non-renew the licenses if objectors provide testimony related to the factors enumerated in MCO 85-4-4 that the Common Council finds to be true by a preponderance of the evidence and/or police reports are found to be true by a preponderance of the evidence. The police reports and other attached documents relating to objections to the license are a part of this notice and expressly incorporated in this notice. The licensee should be prepared to address these matters at the hearing.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing. You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

Limited parking for persons attending meetings during normal business hours is available at reduced rates (5 hour limit) at the Milwaukee Center on the southwest corner of Kilbourn Avenue and Water Street. You must present a copy of the meeting notice to the parking cashier.

Hello Mr. Brostoff,

My name is . and I am currently living on the . near . street in district 3. Just last night, mine and 3 other cars were all broken into on Cass street, right in front of the elementary school on 1647 N Cass St, Milwaukee, WI 53202. After filing a complaint to the police, an officer squad car had taken the initiative to patrol the area, found multiple vandalized cars, and disclosed a person was held at gunpoint outside of the school just recently. These strings of violent incidences have upticked in the area and cause detriment to the safety and mental health of the residents living here.

The restaurant Casablanca has brought in many people who are not from the area who have been parking on our street and have been attracting negative attention. I have witnessed people entering and leaving the restaurant who park on our street, litter, and cause noise disturbances on the street.

I wanted to officially send a complaint in about the restaurant as well as inquire on a camera to be installed facing Cass street to catch the recent vandalism and prevent future breakins or violence from occurring.

There are children, elders, and Milwaukee natives who are affected by these breakins and violent acts and I would like to see how the district will handle these issues. I look forward to hearing back from you at your earliest convenience.

Dear Aldersperson Brostoff,

I'm writing on behalf of [redacted] We have been long-term tenants on [redacted] at [redacted], since 2013. [redacted] has met you a few times before, but I have not. We've been very grateful for your representation of our community at the state level over the past several years, and have been grateful for your efforts since you became our aldersperson. Your presence in our local community as our aldersperson is very welcomed.

Prior to us living together on [redacted] for some years just off [redacted], and then off [redacted] so we have decades of personal history in this neighborhood. I have also both worked [redacted] years, which has given me the opportunity to see the neighborhood evolve from a much closer vantage point.

What we have always loved about Brady is its inclusivity and eclecticism, which allow all types of neighbors, from the very young to the very old, to live, work, and enjoy life here. My days are often punctuated by the happy noise of kids walking to and from school, neighbors commuting to and from work, and visitors patronizing different establishments on the street. We live [redacted], and [redacted]

[redacted], which comes off of [redacted]—the [redacted] use our house's water hookup. Among our neighbors, we feel like we're part of a big family; we joke that we live in a [redacted] Sounds idyllic, and it can be—which is why until now, we've never felt like we needed to write to our aldersperson to ask for anything.

We are compelled to write to you now because of our ten years [redacted], the last few have seen a marked change in the safety of [redacted] particularly when it comes to gun violence. I know you are aware of the most recent shooting at Swing Park, which [redacted] It was the third such shooting at Swing Park inside of a month. This is a dramatic escalation, but it is unfortunately not a surprising one. Things have been getting more dangerous at this end of Brady for a while now, not just at Swing Park, and we are very concerned.

In addition to the recent spate of shootings at Swing Park, there have been three other shootings on our corner of Brady and Van Buren/Holton—two of which happened in front of Casablanca the first in 2021, and the second one a homicide in 2022, both involving their patrons. [redacted] to Casablanca.) The third shooting was a brutal homicide on the Holton/Van Buren side of our corner (this case was recently adjudicated).

We were [redacted] and aware of what was happening at the time of all three of these shootings. The two homicides were especially distressing events, easily some of the worst moments we've ever witnessed. And like the recent shootings in Swing Park, they were senseless, craven, and entirely preventable.

When putting all of these events together over these few years, we in the neighborhood see a rapidly escalating problem of unchecked violence coming to [redacted] brought by people who do not seem to be local to the neighborhood.

Three themes have emerged amidst all this violence:

- the arrival of a much louder, more aggressive late-night clientele [redacted] Casablanca than in years prior
- a significant increase in shootings and reckless driving on the corner of Brady and Van Buren/Holton, even with ongoing construction on the bridge
- a significant increase in late night altercations and shootings at Swing Park

Lest the perception be that [redacted] is entirely young people: we have two neighbors in our [redacted] who are over 70 and each live [redacted]. There are additional elderly neighbors around the corner [redacted]. There are families with young children living [redacted] the corner and [redacted] the street. The rest of us are working people with day jobs (we're in our [redacted]) who just want to live in a vibrant neighborhood we can enjoy in our downtime.

We also don't want *visitors* to this neighborhood to meet with untimely death or injury because of an argument, a misunderstanding, a reckless driving accident, or interrupting rowdy patrons at bar close time. We like to invite family and friends to visit us, but we're less inclined to do that if we don't feel like they can safely walk back to their cars at night. And if people from outside the neighborhood stop visiting [redacted] because they're scared to come here, particularly on evenings and weekends, then the whole neighborhood suffers.

We know that gun violence is a city-wide (and nation-wide) problem, and that young people in particular in Milwaukee, especially young people of color, are being fatally and disproportionately impacted by this gun violence. We understand that some of these issues are systemic and bigger than our neighborhood.

But that said, the current and escalating lack of safety on [redacted] is untenable and unacceptable. It hasn't always been this way, which leads us to believe it can be corrected.

What we do not want: for our neighborhood to become some sort of police zone where young people and people of color are unfairly targeted or surveilled. We believe the current safety issues are caused by a mix of factors that are not exclusive to young people.

What we do want: for constructive action to be taken by community leaders that prioritizes violence prevention and cultivates a lasting climate of safety.

Here are some of our ideas for positive action steps:

- **A re-design of Swing Park.**
 - Bright and well-maintained lighting, a proper playground built to code, and times when it is open and closed. People would not be meeting there late at night or feel emboldened to brandish weapons there if this park were to the level of upkeep that other Milwaukee city parks enjoy.
- **Brighter lighting and more safety features across the marsupial bridge.**
 - Swing Park is currently a gauntlet any student, pedestrian, or cyclist has to navigate if they want to get from the Brady neighborhood to the marsupial bridge to cross the river. Let's prioritize the safety of these travelers.
- **Brighter lighting or similar safety elements for the bike path between Swing Park and the corner of Brady and Van Buren, and the corner with the sculpture (facing Swing Park)—perhaps a lit crosswalk between the bike path and Swing Park/marsupial bridge.**
 - Pedestrians, cyclists, and those waiting for the bus deserve to be protected from traffic, should be able to cross Swing Park to access the marsupial bridge without fear, and should not be forced to travel the bike path in darkness if they're trying to get home or to their vehicle. The sculpture on our corner has fallen into disrepair and adds a needless dark corner.
- **A more respectful and collaborative management of Casablanca's late-night atmosphere: Casablanca owns some of the responsibility for the climate of safety here late at night.**
 - Casablanca's late night clientele has notably changed. Having [redacted] years, they used to be really great [redacted] but the last 3-4 years, a different crowd has absolutely wreaked havoc [redacted], and the current management appears to be willfully oblivious, despite the fact that these patrons have caused two shootings and one homicide inside of two years.
 - This disruption isn't restricted to weekends, which would be more understandable. It's happening on weeknights, too, with regularity.
 - Noise levels after a certain hour on weeknights should be curtailed to respect the many families with young children, working adults, and elderly residents who live in direct proximity to the establishment.
 - The security staff should be actively promoting peaceful conduct and nonviolently de-escalating intoxicated patrons before their violence escalates into the street.
 - In addition to incidents of gun violence in front of Casablanca, there is regularly reckless driving/speeding coming out of their lot at bar close, and there have been

shouting fights and altercations in the parking lot at bar close, which are not, de-escalated by their management.

- After the fatal shooting at Casablanca, no effort was made by the establishment to reach out to neighbors and let us know what they were doing to prevent something like this happening again.
- Several of our neighbors have grown so disgusted by the increased disruptiveness of Casablanca/perceived negligence of management over these last few years, that they have led concerted campaigns to have their liquor license revoked, particularly after the most recent fatal shooting there.
- We appreciate that Casablanca is a longstanding, family-owned business that brings revenue to the neighborhood, so we do not personally advocate for them to lose their liquor license at recent renewal hearings, but if nothing changes, we would support the revocation of their liquor license in the future.
- **Constructive law enforcement presence, rather than reactive policing.**
 - We have a regular bicycle cop who transits Brady throughout the day, and he knows everyone. He's a friendly face in the neighborhood and his community engagement makes you feel like he is here to prevent any problems before they escalate. Could we get some version of this in the evening, rather than the random cop car that just cruises through? Some regular feet on the street, who actually know and have earned the trust of the residents, can help stop a lot of problems before they start.
- **Re-activate the Brady Street firehouse/EMT station as a first response unit instead of a community relations office.**
 - Combined with the ongoing bridge construction, it takes longer for emergency fire or medical response to get to Brady when incidents and accidents do happen.
 - An emergency response presence on Brady used to make a powerful difference in the climate of safety in this neighborhood. We've very much felt the absence of an active fire/EMT presence on our street and in our neighborhood these past five years. Lives can be saved by ensuring a prompt response to emergencies on this busy street.

We want teens to feel like they can come here and have fun; they deserve to be able to enjoy this neighborhood and shouldn't be mistrusted simply because of their youth.

We want kids of all ages to be able to walk to and from school and enjoy the playgrounds in our neighborhood safely, especially on summer days or summer evenings if they need someplace safe to go. This is a fun place for young people and it deserves to stay that way.

We want our elderly neighbors to be able to walk to their activities or wait at the bus stop and not feel they are in danger of being hit by a car, or aggressed by somebody who is drunk, or has come to our neighborhood with bad intent. We have a neighbor who has lived on Brady for 30+ years and is now fearful in a way he hasn't been before. Our senior neighbors deserve better after making such a long-term investment in this neighborhood.

We want to have a good relationship with the owners of businesses in our neighborhood, and not resent their establishments for feeding into this chaos with the way they run their bar service. Good business on Brady rewards the whole neighborhood, fills it with energy and joy, creates job opportunities, and drives revenue the whole city can benefit from. We want businesses on Brady to succeed, and that includes Casablanca. We know of at least one business owner who left because of a perceived downturn in the neighborhood. Let's not lose any more.

We don't think any of these wishes are a tall order, because these things have historically existed in this neighborhood long before we were ever tenants—until very recently, in fact, they were our favorite things about living here. We don't want to leave, but we've already seen several good neighbors depart over these issues, and we feel much more unsafe here than we used to. And that's sad, because this is the longest we've lived anywhere. We started living in this neighborhood and ultimately got here. We'd eventually like to make this a home of ours here. We want to share what we love about Brady with everyone who lives and visits here. That starts with ensuring their safety—the bare minimum we as good neighbors can do.

So we ask that you please consider our suggestions and feedback, and we ask for your help and advocacy in restoring and cultivating greater peace and safety in our corner of the neighborhood. We see the success you've had mobilizing the community at the east end of Brady to make it safer, and now we ask for your insight and support at the west end of the street. You're the person our community needs for this moment. We are reaching out now for the very first time because we are more confident in your leadership than we have been in anyone else's.

Thank you again for everything you've done for us and for our neighborhood: at the state level, and now locally.

Finally, we are truly grateful for your time and consideration in reading this very long letter. It comes from the heart. We love Brady. We want to help make it better.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 05/03/2014 a 20 year old Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, was able to enter Casablanca (728 East Brady Street) unchallenged. This same Milwaukee police aide then purchased a bottle of Miller Lite beer from the bartender unchallenged. The applicant was cited.

Charge: Sale of Alcohol to Underage
Finding: Guilty

2. On 03/03/2015 Milwaukee police officers, along with Department of Revenue Agent Georgeann King, conducted a licensed premise inspection at Casablanca (728 East Brady Street). During this inspection, Agent King confiscated 18 cases of tobacco that had been purchased from an unauthorized distributor in Illinois.

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Item #1 previously reported, disposition added 05/24/2016.

3. On 02/26/2015 a Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, attempted to enter Casablanca (728 East Brady Street). But was turned away when she could not produce proof she had attained the legal drinking age of 21.
4. On 08/07/2015 a 20 year old Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, was able to enter Casablanca (728 East Brady Street) and was served a glass of wine. The applicant was cited.

5. On 03/30/2017 a 19 year old Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, attempted to gain entry to Casablanca (728 East Brady Street). There was no security at the entrance of the business and the police aide was denied service by a bartender.

- =====
6. On 11/29/2018 officers conducted underage tavern enforcement in District 1. The tavern at 728 E. Brady St, Casablanca passed the check.

- =====
7. On 02/13/21 at 1:38am, Milwaukee Police, along with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, conducted a license premise check at 728 E. Brady Street. The applicant stated that his establishment was up to code and no violations occurred.

8. On 04/08/21 at 11:16pm, Milwaukee Police received a call at the First District Police Station complaining about the loud music emanating from 728 E. Brady Street. The call said that she is a neighbor and the loud music coming from the establishment can be heard from inside her residence. She also told the officer that patrons from the tavern, after closing time, play loud music and hang out in the neighborhood yelling. The officer tried to call the applicant but received no answer and left a message.

9. On 05/20/21 at 4:18pm, Milwaukee Police had a meeting with the applicant at 728 E. Brady Street. Topics of the discussion were, a "shots fired" complaint where one of his employees (a suspected drug dealer) was the target, complaints of patrons playing loud music in vehicles, patrons drinking in vehicles, and public urination. The applicant showed officers surveillance cameras that were installed on E. Brady Street and that he would consider the employee, who was the target of violence, employment status. The applicant said that he has contacted a security company to provide security for his establishment.

10. On 06/08/21 at 11:27pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 728 E. Brady Street for a shooting complaint. Investigation revealed that a fight between groups of subjects happened as they were leaving the establishment and security separated the group and told the subjects to leave. The subjects began to fight again at the corner of Cass and Brady. Security responded trying to stop the fight. As the group was leaving a subject approached security, lifted up his shirt to display a handgun and said this was family matter and to let them fight.

Security backed off and observed two other males with firearms in their waist bands. The male and female began to fight again. Security heard 8-10 gunshots. A witness stated a female in the group fired several shots striking one of the subjects to the hip.

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11. On 08/04/21 at 11:16pm, Milwaukee Police called the caller of a noise complaint which was occurring at 728 E. Brady Street. The caller stated that she could clearly hear the music coming from the tavern inside her residence and that it keeps her up at night. She also said that the patrons, at closing time, are loud and hang out in the neighborhood playing loud music and yelling. An officer called the applicant about the complaint but he did not answer the telephone so she left a message.

12. On 02/27/22 at 1:46am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 728 E. Brady Street for a battery complaint. Upon arrival, officers interviewed the caller who stated that the bouncer had punched her in the jaw. Officers interviewed security who said that the caller had been causing a disturbance inside the establishment and had to be escorted out. The security guard said that she was trying to kick people so he had to wrap his arms around her to gain control and escort her out. Multiple people on scene stated that the caller was causing a scene inside the restaurant.

13. On 06/20/22 at 2:00am, a shooting occurred inside the establishment at 728 E. Brady Street. Video surveillance shows a patron and security guard engage in an argument and when the patron produced a handgun, the security guard shoots the patron. Security for the tavern was not checking for firearms with a metal detecting wand or using an identification reader even though these items were provided by the owners. The security guard was arrested for an outstanding parole violation and carrying a concealed weapon.

15. On 08/27/22 at 12:06a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Battery at 728 E. Brady St. Investigation revealed a patron was disorderly and escorted out of the business and no battery occurred. The staff were cooperative with the investigation.

16. On 11/12/22 at 11:27p.m., Milwaukee Police were flagged down by a citizen for a fight in the 1700 block of N. Cass St. Investigation revealed a fight broke out inside Casablanca at 728 E. Brady St. One of the parties involved feared for their safety and went to their car to retrieve their firearm, pointing it at subjects inside the bar. Security was called over and the subject, knew security to be armed, returned their firearm to their vehicle and left the scene, turning themselves into police the next day.

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17. On 11/11/23 at 10:44p.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Fight/Subject with Gun at 728 E. Brady. Officers were advised by the manager two groups of people engaged in a verbal argument inside, which led to the two groups physically fighting outside the establishment. The manager stated one of the subjects threatened to get a gun, however, they never saw a gun. The officers requested video surveillance of the incident, however, at the time of the report never received the video. The officer observed security staff, however, no metal detector devices were observed.

18. On 04/04/24 at 1:40a.m., Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a Shooting at 728 E. Brady St. Officers were advised a physical fight broke out between a patron and a security officer working for the business, at which time the security guard produced a firearm and shot one of the subjects in the arm and chest. The manager on scene was uncooperative, calling witnesses derogatory names and using profane language. The manager continued to be argumentative during the investigation and had to be escorted away by officers. The security guard was arrested and charged with 1st Degree Reckless Injury. Three subjects were issued Battery citations. Video surveillance depicted an altercation between the victim, other patrons, bartender and the security officer.

At approximately 10:44 PM while Monitoring E Brady St and N Arlington St Bar area (Code Red). We responded to a fight at the Fight/ Subject with Gun Complaint located at 1728 E Brady St (which is in the City and County and State of Wisconsin).

INTERVIEW OF OWNER/MANAGER Nas I MUSA

Upon arrival I was approached by the Owner /Manager who identified himself as Nas I MUSA (W/M 04-27-86) I had spoken with the White Tail Manager who identified himself as Alberto VALIE (W/M 09-26-90). MUSA stated that at approximately 10:35 PM he (2) two separate group on the upper floor of his Bar/restaurant arguing. MUSA stated that the argument began to get verbally heated and then both groups began to go outside of the Bar/restaurant. MUSA stated that he then observed both groups fighting each other. MUSA stated one of the people in the group MUSA described as a black male approximately 5'9 medium complexion wearing dark pants and a dark blazer/suit jacket implied that he was going to start shooting the members in the other group.


