WHEREAS, Jerrel Jones was a community mentor and pioneer who uplifted countless individuals across generations, his commitment to communication as a tool for empowerment made him a beacon of strength, and he also valued education and encouraged civic responsibility throughout his career; and

WHEREAS, Jerrel Jones was a devoted husband to his wife of over 60 years, Eanestine, and a proud father to five children, his family, along with the Courier Communications team, carries forward his legacy with pride; now, therefore, be it
