

Combined Firearm Homicide and Non-Fatal Shooting Victims by Year



Combined Firearm Homicide and Shooting Victims by Year through 2nd Quarter (1/1 - 6/30)




2015 Homicides YTD – 87 2014 Homicides YTD – 43 **2015 Shootings YTD** – **296 2014 Shootings YTD** – **249**



Contributing Factors

1/1/2015 - 6/30/15

Drug Nexus compared to 2014:

- 23% (58), + 123%
- 22% (16), 11%

Argument/fight Detail:

- Argument/fight homicides are up 360% (5 to 23)
- Top reasons include: Respect (8), Unknown (4), Jealousy (2)
- Argument/fight shootings are up
 9% (55 to 60)
- Top reasons include: Respect (12), Jealousy (10), Unknown (9) (*Road Rage accounts for 5)



Contributing Factors

1/1/2015 - 6/30/15

Working towards the reduction of violence through innovative interagency collaboration

<u>Juvenile Shooting Involvement:</u>

- 10% (31) of shooting victims were juveniles (decrease of 14% (36) from 2014)
- 4% (4) of the shooting suspects were juveniles (decrease of 33% (6) from 2014)

Juvenile Homicide Involvement:

- 7% (5) homicide victims were juveniles (increase of 25% (4) from 2014)
- 8% (4) of the homicide suspects were juveniles compared to 0 juvenile suspects from 2014


Location:

- Increases of homicides in <u>53216</u> (+1200%, 1 to 13), <u>53210</u> (+700%, 1 to 8) and <u>53218</u> (+400%, 2 to 10)
- Shootings increased in <u>53225</u> (+267%, 3 to 11), <u>53216</u> (+129%, 17 to 39) and <u>53212</u> (+64% 14 to 23)
- Shootings in <u>53218</u> decreased 29% (24 to 17)






Violence Rates for 15-24 YOA Males


2014 Violence Rates per 100,000 Inhabitants for Age 15-24 Males by Race/Ethnicity in Milwaukee





Multiple Offender Analysis

Multiple Offender Incidents:

- +200% (36 to 108) shootings
- +47% (15 to 22) homicides


Median Age of Victim: 24

- Over **85%** of the victims are Black Males
- Over 71% of victims have criminal histories



Multiple Offender Analysis

Working towards the reduction of violence through innovative interagency collaboration



The top three primary factors:

- argument/fight (35%, 29),
- retaliation (25%, 21),
- robbery (22%, 18).
- +142% argument/fights
- +91% retaliation
- --33% in robbery incidents

Median Age of Victim: 23

- Over **80%** of the suspects are Black Males
- Over **96%** of the suspects had criminal histories
