COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS (CIP)

- NIDC CIP matching grants support community projects that engage community members and physically improve neighborhoods in Milwaukee.
 - citywide grant opportunities
 - reimbursable grants
 - dollar-for-dollar matching grants up to \$4,000

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS (CIP)

- Common Council allocates funds to NIDC for implementation of Citywide CIPs:
- 18 projects were approved in 2020 for over
 - \$58,340 leveraging more than \$92,500



This was a City-led project but several community partners: Sherman Park, Walkers Point, Century City and Havenwoods helped to distribute the thousands and thousands of pieces of chalk!

The Mahogany Cares Inc. team partnered with local restaurant Terri Lynn's Express to have a sanitized area where they could prepare community bag lunches and adhere to social distancing guidelines. More than 1400+ **lunches during COVID-19. Using** the Love Your Block Caring **Community COVID-19 Mini-**Grant, the team switched over to hot meals that can be warmed up at home providing another 300 meals.



LYB MKE ART KITS DISTRIBUTION PROJECT



Due to COVID-19 precautions, The Century **City Triangle Neighborhood Association had** to cancel the Summer Art in the Park program for Milwaukee Youth. To ensure that neighborhood youth still had access to art supplies, long time resident and neighborhood leader Yvonne McCaskill applied for funding to make art kits to distribute to Century City Families. Before making the kits, volunteers canvassed the neighborhood and determined which houses had children so they could offer the art kits to those households. With the help of Youth Ambassadors 52 kits were created and distributed to 17+ families throughout the neighborhood.
