This is in response to a request from a local resident to install the above-captioned parking restriction.

Our traffic engineering staff has investigated this request and found south bound motorists on North 77th Street have a difficult time seeing traffic traveling east and west bound on West Congress Street when vehicles park close to the corner. Therefore, in the interest of public safety, we recommend installing these restrictions to increase cross traffic visibility at the intersection.

We will prepare the necessary legislation for the next Public Safety Committee meeting, so that you may support it to final passage.

Dear Aldermen Donovan and Witkowiak:

During the Marquette Interchange Project West Canal Street between South 6th Street and West Roundhouse Road was signed with a no parking anytime restriction to facilitate the movement for the two lanes of traffic in each direction. Now that the construction is over we recommend a change in the parking restrictions thereby removing the present no parking anytime restriction and replacing it with a morning and afternoon peak period parking restriction to facilitate the movement of traffic during these high volume periods and restore on-street parking during the non-peak travel periods.

We will prepare the necessary legislation for the next Public Safety Committee meeting, so that you may support it to final passage.
