SIR:

This report was dictated by Detective Mark LEVENHAGEN, of the Internal Affairs Division/Criminal Investigation Unit (IAD/CIU), day shift.

ALLEGATION:

Complainant Heidi DOPP and a co-manager of Mugs Bunny and Grill, James LOSINIECKI, alleged that on March 2, 2000, four police officers who had entered their establishment had possibly taken \$600.00 in cash from the office area. They also accused Det. Joel PETERSON and Officer Daniel WILCOX of being rude while investigating the use of gambling machines at their tayern.

INVESTIGATION:

Det. LEVENHAGEN interviewed the four officers who were present on March 2, 2000, Det. Joel PETERSON, P.O. Daniel WILCOX, P.O. Michael ANDERSON and P.O. Gregorie MCKAY regarding the incident on March 2, 2000, at 8423 W. Villard, Mugs Bunny Bar and Grill. All four officers stated that they were in the office area when the money was allegedly taken from at one point or another during the investigation into gambling machines at the

tavern. All four officers denied any knowledge of missing money and also denied taking any money from the establishment.

Det. LEVENHAGEN also interviewed the owners, managers and employees of the tavern who were present, during the time that the money was reported missing. All the employees denied taking any money from the tavern.

CONCLUSION:

On Friday, August 4, 2000, I, Det. LEVENHAGEN, along with Captain James SHEPARD went to the District Attorney's office where this case was reviewed by Deputy District Attorney Jon REDDIN. After reading all of the reports Deputy DA REDDIN made the determination that there was no evidence to show any criminal activity by any Milwaukee police officers involved with this incident. Deputy DA REDDIN, after reviewing the reports, also indicated that of the complaining manager/owners of Mugs Bunny Tavern and their employees, there was also no evidence that would lead to charges at this time regarding any of them taking the \$600.00. This investigation is suspended pending any new information that may come forward in the future.
