Dear Members of the Milwaukee Common Council, and Mayor Barrett,

I will be attending tomorrow morning's (Oct. 15, 2019) Common Council meeting to urge you to either OPPOSE or DELAY voting on the resolution to approve the Strauss slaughterhouse at Century City until residents have had ample opportunity to weigh in on it.

Those of you on the Zoning, Neighborhoods, and Development Committee may recall representatives from Strauss referring to the "harvesting" of 500 cattle per day, 40 at a time. It's little wonder why they resort to such euphemisms, and thank you to Alderman Bauman for calling them out on it. Neither Strauss nor Century City appear eager to call this appalling project what it really is, and we mustn't mince words here: this is a slaughterhouse. Simple.
