Background

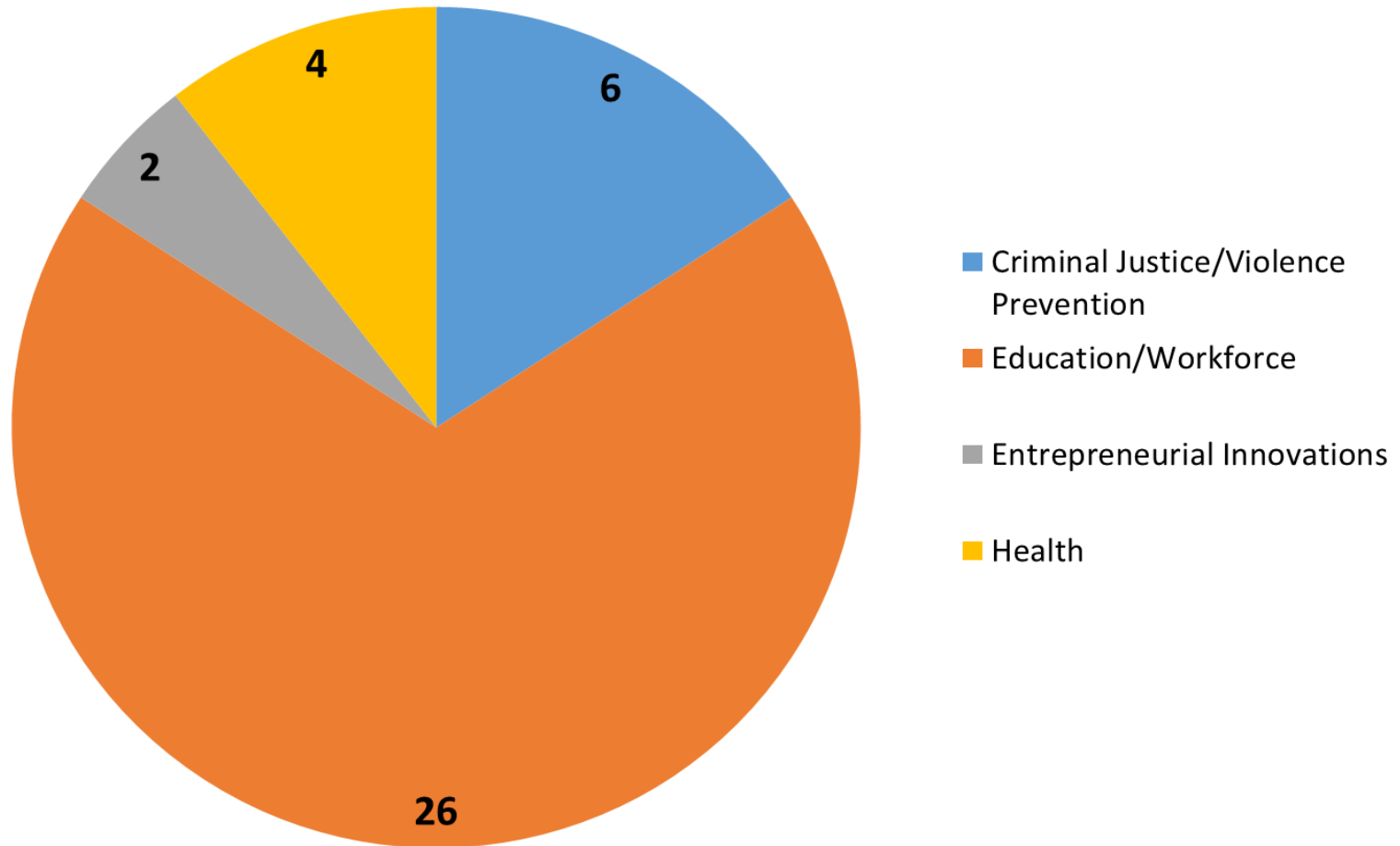
- ❑ City strategic goal: promote racial, social and economic equity for all citizens
- ❑ Disparities in community conditions negatively affect quality of life
- ❑ Reducing disparities improves Milwaukee's social and economic quality
- ❑ Young black males are significantly more likely to experience joblessness, low educational attainment, incarceration, family instability, and other challenges that perpetuate poverty

- ❑ BMAAC requested information on 2018 funding that supports efforts to improve racial inclusion and reduce disparities affecting black men and boys
- ❑ Information organized by BMAAC Subcommittee areas:
 - Education & Workforce Development
 - Criminal Justice & Violence Prevention
 - Health
 - Entrepreneurial Innovations

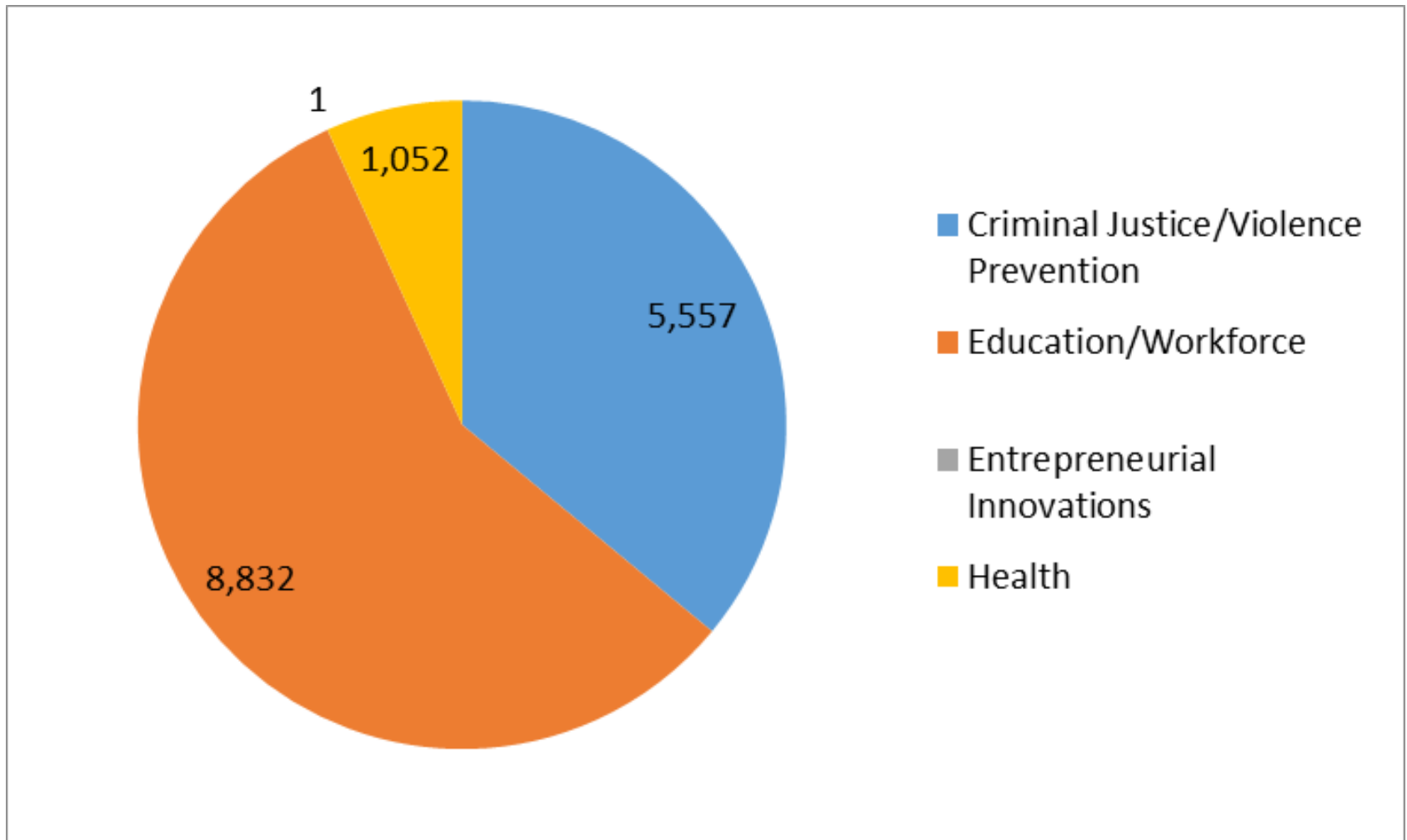
Summary of Programs and Funding

- ❑ Identified 38 programs and initiatives that directly or indirectly provide services to black men and/or boys
- ❑ Services should reduce disparities
- ❑ 2018 funding: \$7.6 million
- ❑ More than 15,000 black men and boys served by these programs in 2017

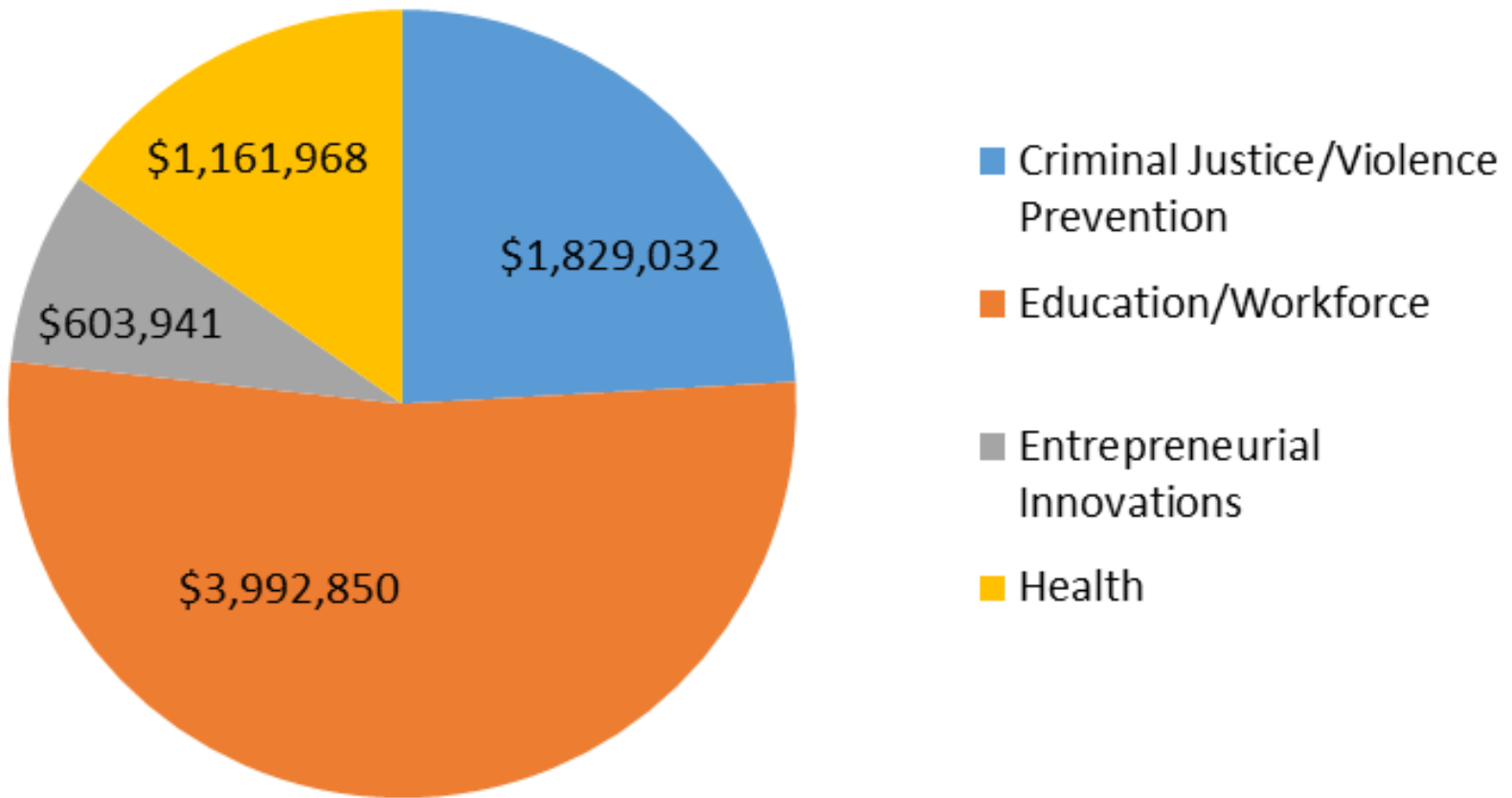
Programs by Purpose



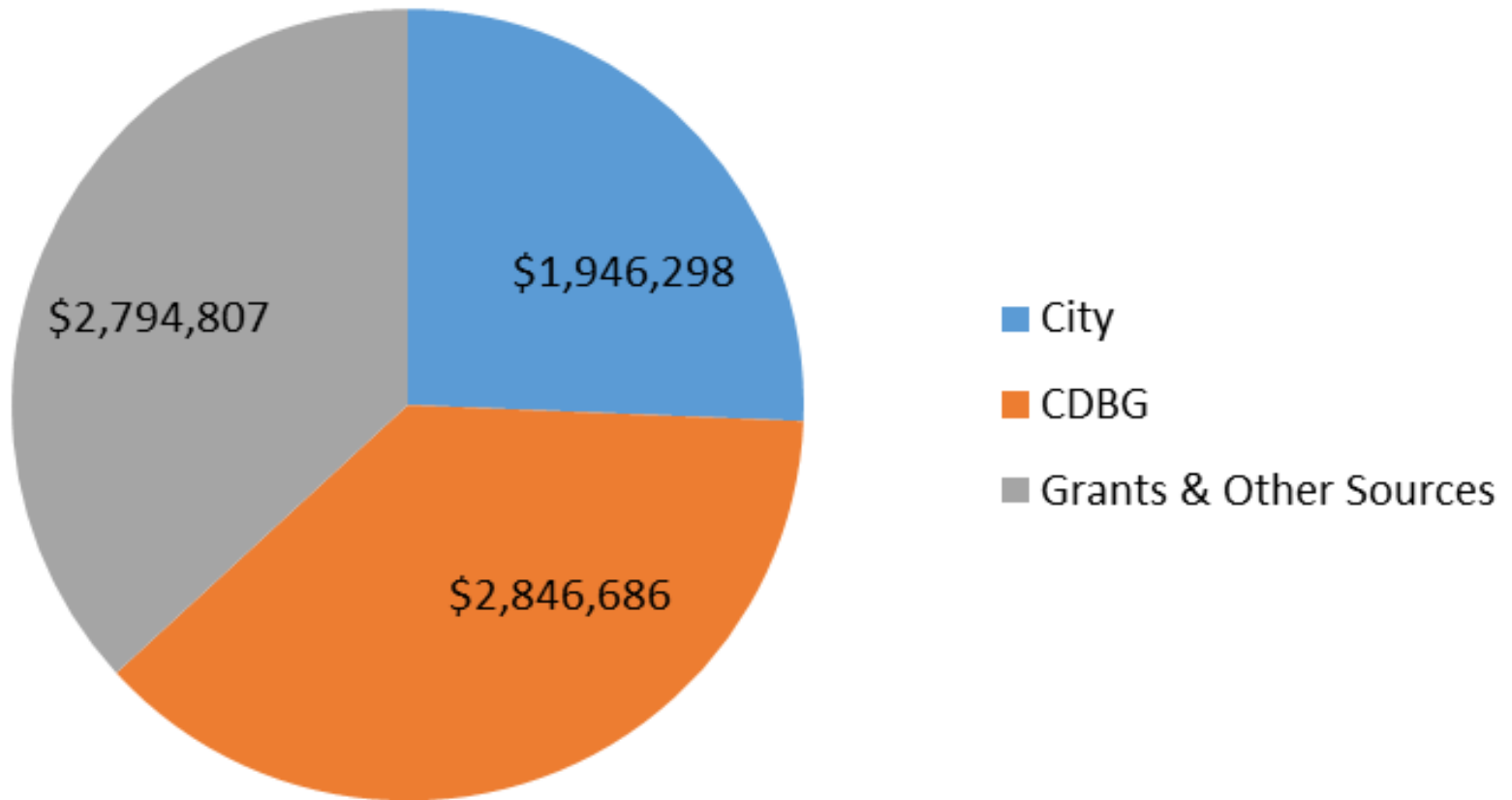
Persons Served by Purpose

- ❑ 26 programs (68%)
- ❑ \$4 million (53%)

- ❑ Summer Youth Internship (\$206,500)
- ❑ Earn and Learn Youth Employment (\$100,000)
- ❑ Milwaukee Builds (\$225,000)
- ❑ Youth Build (\$175,000)
- ❑ Youth Interns (\$25,000)
- ❑ Youth Services (various) (\$845,000)

- ❑ Transitional Jobs (\$339,341)

Criminal Justice & Violence Prevention

- ❑ 6 programs (16%)
- ❑ \$1.8 million (24%)

- ❑ Office of Violence Prevention/RECAST (\$1.18 million)
- ❑ Ceasefire Milwaukee (\$280,000)
- ❑ Police Ambassador Program (\$200,000)
- ❑ Midnight Basketball League (\$20,000)
- ❑ Counsel for Indigent Court Defendants (\$45,000)





Health

- ❑ 4 programs (10%)
- ❑ \$1.2 million (15%)

- ❑ Community Health Care Access Program (\$563,811)
- ❑ Men's Health Program (\$403,157)
- ❑ Crisis Response for Trauma Informed Care Counseling (\$180,000)
- ❑ Youth Services-SDC (mental health/ATODA) (\$15,000)





Entrepreneurial Innovations

- ❑ 2 programs (5%)
- ❑ \$600,000 (8%)

- ❑ Business Capacity Building Program (\$553,941)
- ❑ Technology Growth Initiative (\$50,000)
