In accordance with the provisions of Section 320-21 (11) and (12) of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, the Milwaukee Historic Preservation Commission has issued a certificate of appropriateness for the work listed above. The work was found to be consistent with preservation guidelines. The following conditions apply to this certificate of appropriateness:


The rear wall of this apartment is built with common cream city brick. Deteriorated brick will be removed from wall and new brick will be matched in. Wall is currently painted and after masonry repairs are completed, the rear wall will receive a new coat of paint. Mortar to match existing mortar (cannot be pure Portland cement) to prevent premature failure of the repair and to prevent front of brick from spalling. See pages 81through 86 of As Good As New for information about mortar and repointing techniques.

The failed downspouts that caused the above masonry failure will be replaced. If soffit needs repair wood should match in to existing soffit and not be an applied surface patch.

All work must be done in a craftsman-like manner, and must be completed within one year of the date this certificate was issued. Staff must approve any changes or additions to this certificate before work begins. Work that is not completed in accordance with this certificate may be subject to correction orders or citations. 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Downspouts to be replaced and properly connected to receiver and gutter system.

Deteriorated brick to be removed and new brick patched in. New brick to match existing in size and shape. Mortar to match existing in hardness and color and pointing style.

Plaster patch over brick will be removed.

Soffit area to be repaired.
