- Whereas, A Project Agreement for the installation of traffic signal improvements under the Congestion Mitigation Air Quality program were approved by the Common Council under File Number 220290; and
- Whereas, The Congestion Mitigation Air Quality program is intended to reduce delay and vehicle emissions; and
- Whereas, Forty two intersections have been identified for replacement of traffic signal controllers and installation of improved communications; and
- Whereas, The total estimated cost of the project is \$683,913.73 for the upgrade of

traffic control signals; and

Whereas, The total estimated cost for state review for the projects is \$54,713.10; and

Whereas, \$147,725.37 is not reimbursable and is included in the Division's 2024 Capital Purpose Project Grant Number ST320240000; and

Whereas, \$547,130.98 is reimbursable from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, and should be earmarked for this project in the 2024 Capital Grant and Aids Projects Fund Project Grant Number SP032240100; and

Whereas, \$43,770.48, is non-reimbursable from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation; and

Whereas, The State cannot proceed with any project cost overruns or changes in scope of more than 5% without prior Department of Public Works approval; and

Whereas, The Department of Public Works shall notify the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee at the next scheduled meeting of any such project cost overruns or changes in scope approved by the Department of Public Works; and

9. [240078](#) Resolution directing the Department of Public Works, Operations Division-Forestry Services, to enforce the tall grass and weeds ordinance year-round.
- Whereas, Section 80-17-2 of the Code of Ordinances stipulates that no turf grass or weeds of any kind shall be permitted to grow or stand more than 7 inches on any

property in the city; and

Whereas, By preventing grass and weeds from excessive growth, this provision of the Code helps to prevent the spread of hay fever in people who come into contact with pollens; and

Whereas, Properties with tall grass and weeds quickly become neighborhood eyesores that reduce the quality of life in the surrounding area; and

Whereas, The Department of Public Works, Operations Division-Forestry Services does not generally begin enforcing s. 80-17-2 of the Code until late spring, when some lawns have already been overgrown for weeks, potentially creating hay fever problems for some people and eyesores for neighboring homes and businesses; and

Whereas, Because grass does not grow in winter, residents would not need to be concerned with enforcement of their lots during the rough period of November through February; and

Whereas, In March 2023, the Common Council passed File Number 220110, which allows residents to optionally apply for “no mow May” permits, allowing them to forgo cutting their grass during the month of May; and

Whereas, Enforcement of the tall grass and weeds ordinance year-round would have no effect on the “no mow May” program, which would remain available to those residents who wish to avoid mowing their lawns in the month of May; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the Department of Public Works, Operations Division-Forestry Services is directed to begin enforcement of the tall grass ordinance year-round.

- Whereas, The Common Council adopted File No. 231740 on March 19, 2024, establishing a security footprint for the RNC and establishing regulations and regulation-issuance procedures for the use of city streets and public property during

the RNC; and

Whereas, The RNC will bring substantial business to Milwaukee hotels, restaurants, taverns, entertainment venues, cultural institutions, retail and many other venues, thereby contributing to the economic vitality in the Milwaukee area; and

Whereas, The City of Milwaukee desires to have a successful convention and encourage local businesses to take advantage of the temporary opportunities that may result from this extraordinary special event make to the visit enjoyable for attendees as well as having a streamlined process for conducting business during this time; and

Whereas, The Commissioner of the Department of Neighborhood Services shall be given the tools and discretion to efficiently allocate available permitting and enforcement resources; and

Whereas, The Common Council believe that during the RNC the Department of Neighborhood Services should focus its zoning code enforcement efforts and resources on zoning code violations that threaten public health and safety; now, therefore,

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of Milwaukee do ordain as follows:

1. Zoning Code Enforcement. a. Between July 8 and July 22, 2024, (the “RNC Period”) the commissioner of the department of neighborhood services may suspend enforcement provisions of the following zoning code regulations, provided that non-enforcement does not pose imminent threats to public health and safety:
 - a-1. Temporary banner and advertising signage.
 - a-2. Temporary light and heavy motor vehicle parking and outdoor storage.
 - a-3. Other temporary uses that, in the discretion of the commissioner, do not pose an imminent threat to public health or safety.
- b. The suspension of the enforcement of any zoning code provisions by the commissioner shall not also suspend any requirement that a property owner or

business operator obtain applicable licenses or building permits required for such temporary uses occurring during the dates identified above.

2. Possession of Certain Items Prohibited Within the Security Footprint During the Dates of the RNC. a. Within all public areas of the security footprint established by Common Council File No. 231740, possession of the following items is prohibited during the dates of the RNC:

a-1. Lumber larger than 2 inches in width and 0.25 inches thick, including supports for signs.

a-2. Metal, plastic, or other hard material larger than 0.75 inches thick and 0.0125 inches in wall thickness, including pipe and tubing.

a-3. Any air rifle, air pistol, paintball gun, blasting cap, cestus or other combat glove, billy club, blackjack, sword, saber, hatchet, axe, slingshot, BB gun, pellet gun, wrist shot or wrist rocket, metal knuckles, nunchucks, iron buckle, axe handle, shovel, or other instrument potentially used to cause damage to persons or property.

a-4. Any dangerous ordnance, weapon, or firearm that is prohibited by the laws of the state of Wisconsin under ss. 941.26, 941.28 and 941.298, Wis. Stats.

a-5. Any explosive, explosive device, or incendiary device.

a-6. Any firework or rocket.

a-7. Any drone or other unmanned aircraft system or device.

a-8. Any containers of bodily fluid.

a-9. Any aerosol can.

a-10. Any mace, pepper spray, OC spray or other chemical irritant.

a-11. Any umbrella with a metal tip.

a-12. Any projectile launcher, such as a slingshot, wrist rockets, water gun or water cannon.

a-13. Any adhesive or any rope, chain, cable, strapping, wire, string, line, tape or similar material in a length greater than 6 inches.

a-14. Any glass bottle, ornament, light bulb, ceramic vessel or other frangible or brittle container, regardless of whether the container holds any substance.

a-15. Any lock, including, without limitation, any padlock, bicycle locking device, chain lock or similar device, but not including:

a-15-a. Any integral component of a conveyance or structure.

a-15-b. Any lock when utilized by the owner of private real property to secure temporary or permanent fencing.

a-15-c. Any lock attached to a bicycle.

a-16. Any tent or other shelter, sleeping bag, sleeping pad, mattress, cot, hammock, bivy sack or stove.

a-17. Any cooler or ice chest.

a-18. Any backpack or bag exceeding the dimensions of 18 inches by 13 inches by 7 inches.

a-19. Any laser.

a-20. Any non-plastic container, bottle, can or thermos.

- a-21. Any ladder.
- a-22. Any grappling hook, sledgehammer, hammer, crowbar or prybars.
- a-23. Any canned goods.
- a-24. Any tennis balls or other similarly sized balls.
- a-25. Any other item determined by the chief of police to be a clear and present danger to the safety of others.
- b. The prohibitions of par. a shall not be applicable to:
 - b-1. Any person possessing an item listed in par. a when both of the following are true:
 - b-1-a. The person or the person's employer maintains a place of employment within the security footprint; and
 - b-1-b. The possession of the item is in the normal course of the person's licensed business or employment and to be used within that business or place of employment.
 - b-2. Any person possessing an item listed in par. a when both of the following are true:
 - b-2-a. The person resides within the security footprint; and
 - b-2-b. The item is kept and used within the person's residence.
 - b-3. Any law enforcement personnel or other local, state or federal government employee possessing a prohibited item in the course of that person's authorized duties.
 - b-4. Any licensed medical professional in the performance of that professional's medical duties.

3. Possession of Obstruction Devices; Abandoning Object and Camping in the Security Footprint Prohibited. a. It is unlawful for any person within the security footprint, with the intent to obstruct the public's ability to freely move about on rights-of-way, sidewalks or other areas to which the public has access, to possess, utilize or place any tool, object, instrument, or any combination thereof, that is adapted, designed, or intended to be used for obstructing the public's ability to freely move about on rights-of-way, sidewalks, entrances and exits to private property, or other areas to which the public has access. This shall include, but is not limited to, the maneuver commonly referred to as the "Sleeping Dragon," tripods, bipods, poles, any sections of pipe or containers filled with or wrapped in weighted material, such as concrete, or containing handcuffs, chains, carabiners, padlocks, road stars, or other locking devices.

b. It is unlawful for any person, other than law enforcement, emergency personnel, or an individual properly authorized and credentialed by law enforcement, to inhibit, for any reason, the movement of other persons on streets, rights-of-way or sidewalks.

c. It is unlawful for any person to attach themselves to another person, building, vehicle, or any other fixture or structure with the intent to obstruct the public's ability to freely move about on rights-of-way, sidewalks, entrances and exits to private property, or any other areas to which the public has access.

d. It is unlawful for any person to abandon or place any container or object on the rights-of-way, sidewalks, entrances and exits to private property, or any other areas

to which the public has access, and remove themselves from immediate proximity of the container or object. Any container or object so abandoned or placed shall be subject to immediate search, removal or disposal.

e. It is unlawful to camp in the security footprint.

f. Any government employee performing tasks within the employee's official duties of their government work shall be exempt from this section.

- Whereas, The city of Milwaukee is in the midst of what some have characterized as a “domestic violence homicide crisis”, with four domestic violence-related homicides and one domestic violence-related attempted homicide over a single week in April

2024; and

Whereas, Common Council File Number 230131, a communication relating to administrative and sentinel reviews concerning the death of Bobbie Lou Schoeffling and potential improvements to policies, training, and practices concerning domestic and intimate partner violence, was held to the call of the chair on March 28, 2024; and

Whereas, Attached to File 230131 was the Milwaukee Homicide Review Commission's (HRC) February 2024 document, "Intimate Partner / Domestic Violence: Sentinel Event Review: Report and Recommendations"; and

Whereas, This 2024 document concerns HRC's Sentinel Event Review of the Milwaukee Police Department's (MPD) response to Bobbie Lou Schoeffling's two calls on July 11, 2022 regarding abuse and threats from her intimate partner, wherein several officers did not file reports based on the calls and did not respond to the scene, Schoeffling was found murdered on July 26, 2022, and her ex-boyfriend subsequently was sentenced to life in prison for the murder; and

Whereas, HRC's February 2024 document states that Bobbie Lou Schoeffling's murder revealed "potential gaps in systems intended to protect those experiencing victimization due to domestic or intimate partner violence", leading MPD to request an HRC Sentinel Event Review aimed at addressing "questions and concerns about the response to domestic violence (DV) or intimate partner violence (IV) incidents in Milwaukee as identified through this incident"; and

Whereas, HRC's February 2024 document identifies 57 recommendations across three categories, Priority, Tier 2, and Tier 3, with 24 Priority recommendations concerning "Resources", "Response Coordination", "Modifying Approach to DV Response", "Research and Evaluation", "Emergency and Law Enforcement Response", "District Attorney Response", "Corrections Response", "Community Outreach, Education, and Awareness", "Statutory/Legislative", and "Postvention"; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the Milwaukee Homicide Review Commission is urged to provide quarterly updates to the Common Council on implementation of the 24 Priority recommendations from its February 2024 document, "Intimate Partner / Domestic Violence: Sentinel Event Review: Report and Recommendations".
