
- 92,400 are under age 25

- White House MBK Summit (February 2015)

Key decisions made:

- Lead entities established for each identified success targets (CYE, CA, UWM, P3, NPC, City)
- Lead entities to work with identified members and supporters to make progress on success target by defining and measuring indicators

- GOAL: Secure dedicated funding and legitimizing authority to coordinate and actualize BMOC/MBK work across Milwaukee (planning and implementation)

Community Engagement and Communications



Steering and Shared Governance

- GOAL: (1) Clear and agreed upon levels and roles of leadership, governance and on-boarding to organize and structure BMOC/MBK work across Milwaukee (2) Transition of work from planning team to steering group (planning team intended to expand into BMOC steering group)
- LEAD: Nonprofit Center with CA-PPI and City of Milwaukee
- TIMELINE: As soon as possible
