


On Saturday, July 26, NBC-LEO President James Mitchell, Jr. will host a Youth Summit.



As October 2006, the coveted collection of some of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s most famous writings are finally back in Atlanta for good! The 10,000-piece collection will be owned by Morehouse, where they will be made available for research, public access and exhibits.
