640.15 VEHICLE OPERATIONS – GENERAL (WILEAG 6.1.6, 6.2.6)

A. OPERATING REQUIREMENTS

- 8. Department members shall not convey citizens in department vehicles except in conjunction with official business. However, when in the course of their duties police members come upon a victim of a crime or a person who, in their judgment, requires assistance for safety reasons, such person may be transported to a secure location or to the nearest police facility. Members assigned to the Patrol Bureau may operate their department vehicle outside of their district to convey a citizen in accordance with this subsection when authorized by the member's shift commander.
- 9. Members assigned to the Patrol Bureau may operate their department vehicle outside of their district when authorized by the member's shift commander. This subsection does not apply when the police member/operator is in immediate pursuit of a law violator, is making a prisoner conveyance, when directed to respond by the Technical Communications Division, or in exigent circumstances.
- 10. Members operating unmarked department vehicles shall obey all local parking ordinances and regulations barring any exigent circumstances.

C. OPERATION BEYOND CITY LIMITS

2. Travel within Milwaukee County

Department vehicles may be operated anywhere in the Milwaukee County area for specific police purposes when authorized by the member's shift commander.

- 23. Intrastate Travel Outside Milwaukee County
 - a. Department vehicles may be operated anywhere in Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Racine, Washington, and Waukesha County for specific police purposes when authorized by the member's commanding officer, or in his/her absence the field inspector shift commander or acting shift commander.

- b. Department vehicles may be operated anywhere in the state of Wisconsin outside of the four counties listed in subsection (2)(a) for specific police purposes when authorized by an inspector or assistant chief, or the field inspector night watch commander, or a Criminal Investigation Bureau (CIB) commanding officer for members assigned to the CIB.
- c. An *Out-of-Town Trip Record* (form PB-6) shall be filed whenever intrastate travel occurs in accordance with subsection (2)(b) except when in vehicle pursuit or when the Facility Services Division conveys a vehicle outside the jurisdiction for Fleet Services purposes.

34. Interstate Travel

Vehicles shall be used for interstate travel in accordance with the following provisions:

a. A commanding officer An assistant chief, or his/her designee, authorizes their use.

45. Procedure For Out Of Town Travel

c. All requests for out-of-town squads/vehicles must be approved by a member of the executive command staff, or their designee, the appropriate supervisor listed in subsection (2) or (3) above who will affix his/her signature and rank to the "Approved/Denied" portion of the PB-6 report.

640.20 MOBILE COMMAND POST AND EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT TRUCK (WILEAG 6.1.2)

A. MOBILE COMMAND POST (SQUAD 991)

The mobile command post shall be requested through the Technical Communications
Division with the authority of a captain or higher rank for occurrences listed in
subsection 1. Shift commanders shall contact the field inspector night watch
commander if their commanding officer is not available.
