## 1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The Milwaukee Breast and Cervical Cancer Awareness Program (MBCCAP) is a care coordinator for the Department of Health Services Wisconsin Well Woman Program (WWWP) grant. MBCCAP serves as a care coordinator by enrolling eligible persons into the WWWP program that pays for breast and cervical cancer screenings, diagnostics, and case management. Additionally, the program serves as a navigator for persons to receive Well Woman Program services at external provider locations.

## 2. Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

It is the mission of the Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) to advance the health and equity of Milwaukeeans.

The program provides services to low income noninsured persons. The values of MHD include innovation, equity, collaboration, courage, accountability, and quality. Our program acts on these values by mobilizing Public Health (PH) 3.0 and placing more effort into the following:

- Serve as a linkage to cross sector collaboration with hospital systems to aid collective impact and care access as a trusted healthcare entity.
- Increase community engagement via messaging, partnership building, supporting community organizing and capacity building.

Ways we have started this work is by:

- Increasing data collection with the aid of an Electronic Health Record (EHR)
- Engaging with the community by participation at events
- Hosting local colleges for community/PH education and experience
- Networking and collaboration with other organizations
- Aid staff professional development to better address patient care via attendance at conferences and on-line trainings

## 3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

The grant funds allow us to provide breast and cervical cancer screening, care coordination, health education/awareness, and community collaboration. This impacts other programs by bringing awareness to MHD and its services/programs upon which referrals can be made

## 4. Results Measurement/Progress Report (Applies only to Programs):

Results are measured using the MHD electronic health record which allows for tracking of enrolled persons and services received. MBCCAP also tracks its participation in community events. Reporting forms are required to be completed by all providers who perform care for enrolled persons. These reporting forms collect data for DHS which is reported to the Centers for Disease Control. MBCCAP can request these reports from the state.

## 5. Grant Period, Timetable and Program Phase-Out Plan:

July 1, 2025 through June 30 2026. The program does not have a phase out plan. It will be reassessed and updated per completion of the grant period.
