

**Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement
Between the City of Milwaukee and the Milwaukee Board of School Directors
for the Provision of Law Enforcement Services to MPS**

This Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement for the Provision of Law Enforcement Services to Milwaukee Public Schools (“Cooperative Agreement”) is entered into by and between the City of Milwaukee, acting through its Acting Chief of Police, Dale Schunk, and the Milwaukee Board of School Directors (“Board”), acting through its President, Peter Blewett.

WHEREAS, The Board and the City of Milwaukee both qualify as “municipalities” authorized to enter into contracts for the receipt or furnishing of services pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.0301; and

WHEREAS, The Board has determined that non-students have been creating disturbances by confronting students, staff and others associated with certain schools while the latter are leaving the schools and in the vicinity of the schools; and

WHEREAS, The Board, acting pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.0301, has requested the City of Milwaukee Police Department (“MPD”) to provide patrol services, more precisely defined herein, to certain schools between 3:00 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. on each school day;

WHEREAS, the Acting Chief has agreed to specially assign police officers in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Cooperative Agreement;

WHEREAS, the Common Council has approved this Cooperative Agreement via Common Council Resolution File No. 071004 adopted _____ and authorized the Chief to execute it on the City’s behalf; and

WHEREAS, the Board on _____ approved this Cooperative Agreement authorizing the Board President to execute it on behalf of MPS;

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration hereinafter set forth, the parties agree as follows:

1. MPD will furnish fully-marked police squads (“squads”) with 2 on-duty officers to patrol certain schools during the hours of 3:00 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. on each school day.

2. For purposes of this Cooperative Agreement, a school day is defined as days that students are scheduled to attend class according to the Milwaukee Public Schools 2007-2008 School Calendar, attached as Exhibit A and herein incorporated by reference.

3. The purpose of this Cooperative Agreement is to improve the safety of students, staff and others while they are leaving the schools and in the vicinity of the schools at the end of the school day.

4. At all times and under all circumstances under this Cooperative Agreement, MPD personnel shall remain under the sole command of MPD supervisors, and shall remain the employees of the City of Milwaukee for any and all purposes whatsoever. The action of the MPD personnel shall be governed by the policies and practices of the City and the MPD as exercised in the discretion of the City and Chief.

5. The term of this Cooperative Agreement shall be from _____ until _____.

6. The City shall be compensated for specially assigning MPD officers in accordance with this Cooperative Agreement at the actual overtime rate of the MPD officers performing services pursuant to this Cooperative Agreement. All monies paid pursuant to the terms of this Cooperative Agreement shall be paid into the Reimbursable Services Advance Fund and total payments to the City shall not exceed \$60,000.00. The City shall submit bills to the Board on a monthly basis. The monthly billings shall be based upon the MPD’s biweekly pay periods for

police officers assigned to MPS events under this Cooperative Agreement in the previous month. Bills should be sent to Milwaukee Public Schools, Attention: Michelle Nate, P.O. Box 2181, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53201-2181. Payments shall be made within 30 days of billing receipt and shall be sent to: Police Administration Building, Budget & Finance Division, 749 West State Street, Room 714, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53233.

7. Either party may terminate this Cooperative Agreement without cause upon delivery of a written notice to the other party specifying that the Cooperative Agreement shall be terminated no sooner than 5 days after the delivery of the notice of termination. The City shall be compensated for all special assignments provided prior to the date of termination.

8. The City may, at its option, terminate this Cooperative Agreement upon failure of MPS to pay any amounts that may become due hereunder for a period of 45 days following the submission of appropriate billing and supporting documentation. Upon said termination, the City shall be paid the amounts due for all special assignments completed through the completed date of termination.

9. MPS may, at its option, terminate this Cooperative Agreement if the City fails to fulfill any of its obligations under this Cooperative Agreement in a timely and proper manner, violates any provisions of this Cooperative Agreement, or fails to meet these goals set forth in section 3 of this Cooperative Agreement. MPS shall thereafter have the right to terminate this Cooperative Agreement by written notification delivered to the Chief specifying the alleged violation and the effective date of termination. The Chief shall thereafter have 5 days to remedy the alleged violation. If the alleged violation is not remedied to the satisfaction of MPS after said 5 day period, MPS may terminate this Cooperative Agreement for cause. In the event of termination, MPS shall be liable only for special police assignments completed through the date

of termination. As an alternative to termination, MPS retains the right to cancel the termination notice or delay the effective date of the notice of termination beyond the initial 5 day cure period, or otherwise establishes appropriate procedures to avoid future violations.

10. The City and MPS shall be solely liable for all acts undertaken by their respective employees, agents and officers.

11. Nothing in this Cooperative Agreement is intended to reduce or eliminate the law enforcement jurisdiction which the City, Chief and MPD would have in the absence of this Cooperative Agreement.
