		AB-71 Requiring that patients be informed of health care facility use charges and that the charges be identified separately on bills.
		AB-649 Prohibiting municipal electric or water utilities from collecting certain utility arrearages from owners of rental properties as property liens.
		SB-403 Property tax exemptions for low-income housing.
		Updates may be provided for informational purposes only on bills already acted on by the committee.

		\$9,266.24 claim related to a sewer backup as a result of city tree roots. The City Attorney's position is that the roots were in the sewer lateral, which is the property owner's responsibility.

		<u>Sponsors:</u> THE CHAIR
		\$7,900 claim related to damage to a private vehicle that was struck by another vehicle which the police were pursuing. The City Attorney's position is that the police acted appropriately.

		\$1,929.89 claim related to a private vehicle whose driver was stopped by the police. The City Attorney's position is that there is no evidence that the alleged damage was caused by a city employee.

		\$32.70 claim for medical expenses related to a fall on a public sidewalk. The City Attorney's position is that the city had no notice of this hazard prior to the incident.

		<u>Sponsors:</u> THE CHAIR
		\$22,791.19 claim related to damage caused to 2 private vehicles by a pothole. The City Attorney's position is that this section of roadway is under jurisdiction of Milwaukee County.
11.	<u>071345</u>	Resolution relating to a claim from Tamara Norwood-Thomas relating to denial of a Class "B" Tavern license. (2nd Aldermanic District)

		A claim in excess of \$2,000,000 related to denial of an alcohol establishment license.  The City Attorney's position is that the denial of the license was based upon

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neighborhood testimony.
