Council Member Salary Survey

The following is in response to your request for information about salaries for City Council Members:

A salary survey of City Council Member salaries from across the county was conducted. An existing list from a salary survey conducted in February of 2003 was used as a base list and an additional 9 cities were added, resulting in a total of 28 cities. The cities were contacted via phone and the resulting data is presented in the attached table.

The attached table, "Salaries of City Council Members," presents the city, its population and rank as of the 2000 census, the size of the council, the present Council Member salary and the present salary of the Council President. It is noted that in some Councils the Mayor presides over the Council and therefore the Mayor's salary is listed for the Council President. There are 6 cities where this is the case: Portland, San Jose, Cincinnati, Austin, Kansas City and Las Vegas. Other notes include salary differences for other council positions and differences due to staggered terms of office.
