City of Milwaukee Historical Preservation Criteria –

(Reworded for the Palms on State Street the Cultural Historical significates of the 80's)

(See actual criteria attached.)

- 1) Exemplifies the culture heritage of the City of Milwaukee, State of Wisconsin or of the United States.
- 2) It is the site of a significant historic event.
- 3) It identifies with people who significantly contributed to the culture and development of Milwaukee and the Nation.
- 4) It portrays an era of history.
- 5) It embodies cultural historical significates.
- 6) It is identified as a work of art the influenced our culture.
- 7) It embodies reuse of post – World War II structures during the decades after it was built – the 80's.
- 8) It is represents “History through the ages” – 1970's & 1980's – (30 to 35 years ago)
- 9) Its unique location represents a period in time on the West side of Milwaukee that can be showcased.
- 10) It was a reuse of early 19th century building that shaped our culture.

National Historic Landmark Criteria

- 1) Site was where events of national historical significance occurred. -- (Culture History)

- 2) Icon of ideas the shaped the nation.
- 3) Outstanding example of design or construction.
- 4) Place that characterized a way of life.
- 5) Archeological sites able to yield information.

A **National Historic Landmark (NHL)** is a **building, district, object, site, or structure** that is officially recognized by the **United States government** for its outstanding historical significance. Of over 85,000 places listed on the country's **National Register of Historic Places**, only some 2,500 are recognized as National Historic Landmarks.

A **National Historic Landmark District** may include **contributing properties** that are buildings, structures, sites or objects, and it may include non-contributing properties. Contributing properties may or may not also be separately listed.

Criteria [edit]

NHLs are designated by the **United States Secretary of the Interior** because they are:

- Sites where events of national historical significance occurred;
- Places where prominent persons lived or worked;
- Icons of ideals that shaped the nation;
- Outstanding examples of design or construction;
- Places characterizing a way of life; or
- Archeological sites able to yield information.

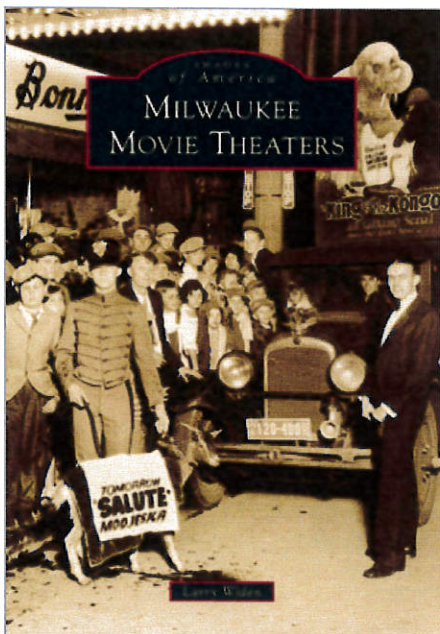

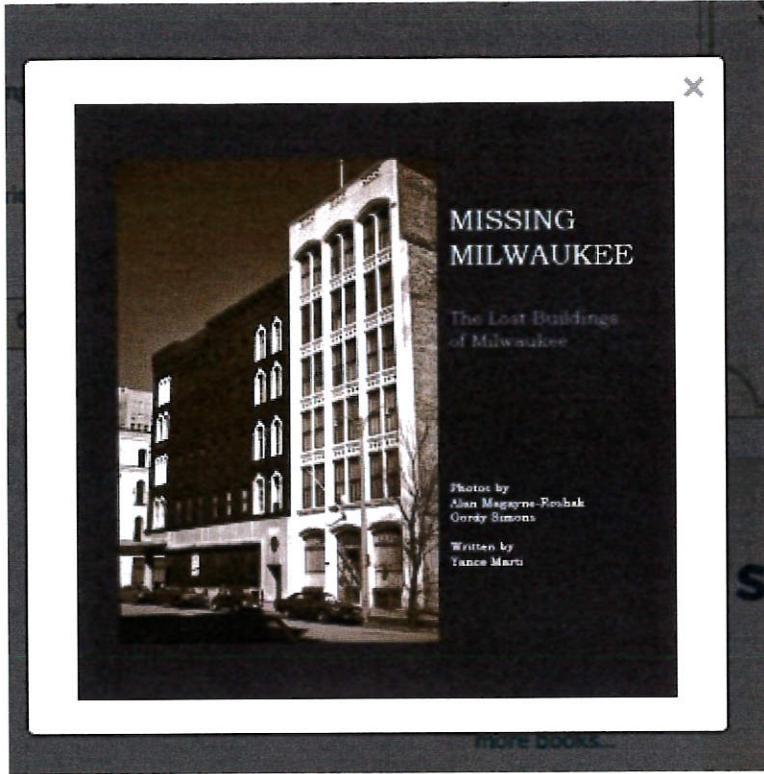

DESIGNATION CRITERIA

- e-1. Its exemplification of the development of the cultural, economic, social or historic heritage of the City of Milwaukee, State of Wisconsin or of the United States.
- e-2. Its location as a site of a significant historic event.
- e-3. Its identification with a person or persons who significantly contributed to the culture and development of the city.
- e-4. Its portrayal of the environment of a group of people in an era of history characterized by a distinctive architectural style.
- e-5. Its embodiment of distinguishing characteristics of an architectural type or specimen.
- e-6. Its identification as the work of an artist, architect, craftsman or master builder whose individual works have influenced the development of the city.
- e-7. Its embodiment of innovation in architectural design or engineering, pre- or post- World War II, expressed in design, details, materials, craftsmanship, construction techniques or function of one or more buildings or structures.
- e-8. Its relationship to other distinctive areas which are eligible for preservation according to a plan based on an historic, cultural, or architectural motif.
- e-9. Its unique location as a singular physical characteristic which represents an established and familiar visual feature of a neighborhood, community or the city.
- e-10. Its association with pre-European settlement
