As all of us realize, stability in neighborhoods like Sherman Park is something to be sought after. The Jewish community in that area, under the leadership of Rabbi Twerski and his Rabbi sons, is a prime example of a stable neighborhood. When I served on the SPCA Board, I was the chair of the Land Use Council.
