File # 020507 is a resolution relative to application, acceptance and funding of the Congenital Disorders Grant.

## Background

- 1. This resolution authorizes the Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) to apply for, accept and fund the Congenital Disorders program from the State of Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services.
- 2. This is a grant continuation. MHD has received funding for this program for approximately 15 years.

# **Discussion**

- 1. The purpose of this program is to screen every infant born for rare disorders including hypothyroidism and sickle cell diseases. Approximately 150 screens are performed in a 12-month grant period.
- 2. 90% of the identified cases of sickle cell diseases in Wisconsin live in the Milwaukee area.
- 3. In addition to screening, project outreach assists families in accessing medical care for follow-up testing and appropriate continuing care from medical providers. MHD staff participation in this grant includes advocacy and education regarding congenital disorders.
- 4. This program also provides education to clients and medical professionals regarding newborn screenings. Children with positive screens are referred to the appropriate medical provider.
- 5. This grant encompasses the period of July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

#### Fiscal Impact

- 1. The total amount of this grant is \$121,627, entirely from the grantor.
- 2. This grant will fund the following existing MHD positions with salary and fringe benefits:
  - 1 Public Health Nurse Supervisor (0.75 FTE), SG 007

- 1 Clinic Assistant (0.5 FTE), SG 309
- 1 Public Health Nurse (0.15 FTE), SG 666
- 1 Office Assistant II (0.6 FTE), SG 410
