BACKGROUND

- 2005 Exploring Public Health Accreditation Project was undertaken by RWJ Foundation with the goal to implement a method for a systematic approach to public health nationwide
- May 2007 Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB) initiated to oversee process nationally
- February 2009 PHAB releases draft of Standards & Measures
- September 2011 Finalized Version 1.0 of the PHAB Standards & Measures released and accreditation officially available for State, Local and Tribal health departments
- 2013 City of West Allis, Counties of Polk, Wood and Kenosha accredited in Wisconsin (tied for the most accredited in any state)



BACKGROUND

- PHAB Standards & Measures- 250 pages requesting documentation to demonstrate:
 - Quality of Services Provided
 - Documentation of 10 Essential Public Health Services
 - Focus on Community Engagement
 - Programmatic Performance Measurement
 - Workforce Development
 - Assessment and Improvement
 - Strategic Planning
 - Communication Plan

- Completion of Three Main Prerequisites:
 - Community Health Assessment (CHA)

- Establishment of Accreditation Team and Domain Workgroups
- Electronic documentation of the PHAB Standards & Measures
- Education for all staff on Public Health Accreditation
- Community Engagement
- Quality improvement throughout the Department

- Completion of CHA, CHIP and Strategic Plan
- Sharing our CHA, CHIP and Strategic Plan with Milwaukee community
- Focus on workforce development
