Inauguration Ceremony Wednesday for Milwaukee Youth Council

Common Council President Willie L. Hines, Jr. will deliver remarks during a public inauguration ceremony for the members of the second **City of Milwaukee Youth Council (http://city.milwaukee.gov/YouthCouncil)** at 5:30 p.m. tomorrow (**Wednesday, November 10**) in the third floor Common Council Chamber at City Hall.

The 2010 Youth Council, composed of young leaders between 14 and 18 years of age, is designed to serve and advance the interests of city youth as a representative body in government through a working partnership with the Common Council and the mayor. After an aggressive and strategic outreach campaign, a total of 142 young people applied for the council, and the 15 members (each representing one of the city's 15 aldermanic districts) were selected from a group of 28 nominated finalists interviewed by a panel of independent community volunteers.

The Common Council approved the 2010 Youth Council's term on November 3.

Alderman Joe Davis, Sr., who first suggested the City of Milwaukee Youth Council in 2004, said the 2010 Youth Council is "composed of talented, bright, and energetic young people looking to make a positive imprint" on Milwaukee.

"This fine group of young leaders is looking to lend their ideas and energy to improve the quality of life for their peers and for the city as a whole," he said. "I am looking forward to watching them deliberate, and to listening to what they have to say."

The 2010 City of Milwaukee Youth Council is:

District 1: Hikeem Williams-Davis, 14
