## STATEMENT OF THE MILWAUKEE COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE, AUGUST 16, 2003

It is extremely important to the community that the truth be known about this incident. Nabor's decision to authorize his attorney to state that he, Nabors, had in fact picked up the firearm thrown toward him by his associate serves that purpose.

There obviously has been much pain connected with this incident. Nabors himself was seriously wounded, has had several operations and faces whatever long term physical problems may remain. Officer Lutz has suffered from the false accusation that he shot an unarmed man who was holding his hands in the air. This community as well was divided by the false accusation.

A struggle over a firearm between police and a person who has been carrying that firearm concealed on his person is a life and death struggle. Nabors's associate, who was in such a struggle, threw the firearm toward Nabors in apparently an unplanned act. Nabors is a 26-year-old street-savvy man who spent years in prison for a conviction involving him as a shooter. Nabors surely knew that with officer Lutz shouting for him not to touch the gun and to drop it that he, Nabors, was engaging in a very dangerous act to himself in picking up the weapon.

Nabors was known to officer Lutz, who had reason to believe that Nabors was a dangerous person. As noted above, Nabors has in fact been convicted as an offender in a dangerous shooting. When Nabors picked up the gun contrary to Lutz's order, officer Lutz had reason to believe that with Nabors facing him with a gun, Lutz's own life was in danger and that there were proper grounds to shoot Nabors.

Deputy District Attorney Jon Reddin and I have carefully evaluated the evidence gathered by police and our investigators. We had hoped in our investigation to find a truly disinterested minister, priest or rabbi-type person who had witnessed the whole incident. We did not find such a person. While some persons recanted claims that Nabors was unarmed with his hands in the air, others persisted in maintaining that false position.

The resolution reached today will hopefully put to rest the polarizing nature of this incident, will establish the truth of what occurred, and is far superior to man a divisive trial, the result of which might not satisfy anyone.
