Recommendation of non-renewal, based upon a public hearing before the Public Safety Committee and the police report, of the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license of Hamdy M. Abdelfatah.

Recommendation of renewal with a 10-day suspension, based upon a public hearing before the Public Safety Committee and the police report, of the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license of Vikramjit Verma.

Re: Report of the Renewal Application of Hamdy M. Abdelfatah for a Public Passenger Vehicle Driver License.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Hamdy M. Abdelfatah (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Said license expired at midnight, October 31, 2006.
- 2. An application to renew said license was filed with the Office of the City Clerk on September 18, 2006.
- 3. Pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. The Milwaukee Police Department filed an objection to renewal of this license dated September 19, 2006. That objection could form the basis of non-renewal or suspension of this license.
- 4. On October 23, 2006, the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee, pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes of police objections that could form the basis for suspension or non-renewal of the license of the licensee and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the police report on November 1, 2006 at 10:00 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee did appear and was represented by Attorney Ahmed Quereshi, 161 West Wisconsin Avenue, Suite 5181, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53203.

- 5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:
 - A. On June 18, 2006 the applicant was charged in Milwaukee County with possession with intent to deliver-THC, conspiracy, party to a crime, under §§ 961.41(1M(H)4, 961.41 (1X), 939.05. This matter is currently pending a jury trial on December 13, 2006.
 - B. The licensee was charged with possession of more than 2,500 grams and less than 10,000 grams of THC.
 - C. The licensee admitted that he was using his cab, but claimed it was not for hire at the time of his arrest.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24, Wisconsin Statutes.
- Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, Hamdy M.
 Abdelfatah, has not met the criteria of Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances
 or § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes to allow renewal of his Public Passenger Vehicle
 Driver license based upon the police report.
- 3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Public Safety Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to not renew the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license held by Hamdy M. Abdelfatah based upon the police report.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee, by a vote of four (4) ayes, zero (0) noes, and one (1) excused recommends that the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license of Hamdy M. Abdelfatah be denied based upon the police report.

Re: Report of the Renewal Application of Vikramjit Verma for a Public Passenger Vehicle

Driver License.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Vikramjit Verma (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Said license expired at midnight, October 31, 2006.

- 2. An application to renew said license was filed with the Office of the City Clerk on October 16, 2006.
- 3. Pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. The Milwaukee Police Department filed an objection to renewal of this license dated October 17, 2006. That objection could form the basis of non-renewal or suspension of this license.
- 4. On October 18, 2006, the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee, pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes of police objections that could form the basis for suspension or non-renewal of the license of the licensee and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the police report on November 1, 2006 at 10:00 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee did appear and admitted receipt of the notice and was not represented by counsel.
- 5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:

- A. On August 17, 2006 applicant's license was suspended for 47 days by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation for failure to pay fines. Applicant failed to surrender his public passenger license as required by City Ordinance § 100-59-1b.
- B. On October 9, 2006 applicant's license was suspended for three days by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation for failure to pay fines. Applicant failed to surrender his public passenger license as required by City Ordinance § 100-59-1b.
- C. On October 11, 2006 applicant's license was suspended for one day by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation for failure to pay fines. Applicant failed to surrender his public passenger license as required by City Ordinance § 100-59-1b.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24, Wisconsin Statutes.
- 2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, Vikramjit Verma, has not met the criteria of Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances or § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes to allow renewal of his Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license without undergoing a ten (10) day suspension based upon the police report.
- In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Public Safety Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to renew the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license held by Vikramjit Verma with a ten (10) day suspension based upon the police report.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee, by a vote of three (3) ayes and two (2) noes, recommends that the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license of Vikramjit Verma be renewed with a ten (10) day suspension based upon the police report.

Said suspension is to be in effect upon action of the Common Council on November 14, 2006 and for ten days thereafter.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Ralph J. Williams (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Said license expired at midnight, October 31, 2006.

- 2. An application to renew said license was filed with the Office of the City Clerk on September 28, 2006.
- 3. Pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. The Milwaukee Police Department filed an objection to renewal of this license dated September 29, 2006. That objection could form the basis of non-renewal or suspension of this license.
- 4. On October 18, 2006, the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee, pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes of police objections that could form the basis for suspension or non-renewal of the license of the licensee and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the police report on November 1, 2006 at 10:00 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee did not appear and was not represented by counsel.

- 5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:
 - A. Notice was sent to Ralph J. Williams at 4466 North 46th Street, Milwaukee, WI 53218, along with a copy of the police report on October 18, 2006 in an envelope which was sent by U.S. first-class prepaid mail in an envelope bearing the return address of the License Division, 200 East Wells Street, Room 105, Milwaukee, WI 53202. The address of 4466 North 46th Street, Milwaukee, WI 53218 was the address given by the applicant on his renewal application. The notice included a copy of the police report. The licensee failed to appear at the hearing and the envelope containing the notice and police report was not returned to the License Division by the U.S. Postal Service.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24, Wisconsin Statutes.
- 2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, Ralph J. Williams, has not met the criteria of Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances or § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes to allow renewal of his Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license based upon nonappearance.
- 3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Public Safety Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to not renew the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license held by Ralph J. Williams based upon nonappearance.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee, by a vote of five (5) ayes and zero (0) noes, recommends that the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license of Ralph J. Williams be denied based nonappearance.
