DEAR PROPERTY OWNER:

The Common Council has referred to the City Plan Commission for recommendation File No. 041211, being a substitute ordinance amending the 100-year Floodplain boundary along the Menomonee River watershed, in the 8th, 10th, and 15th Aldermanic Districts. The Valley Park Flood Management Project completed by the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD), resulted in MMSD building a seven-foot-high, 800-foot-long levee and a five-foot- high, 750-foot-long floodwall. A one-million-gallon, underground storage tank for stormwater was also built, and a Milwaukee County Park was enhanced by doubling its size to three acres. See the enclosed sheet for both the revised FEMA FIRM floodplain panel and the revised floodplain boundary with properties for the Menomonee River Valley Park area. Properties that are exclusively within Flood Zone X are not required to carry flood insurance by the federal government. However, these properties are at a relatively small risk for flooding and you may be required by your lender to purchase reduced rate flood insurance from a private insurance/ mortgage company. Flood Zone X property owners can also purchase flood insurance on their own initiative.

Properties that are exclusively within Flood zone AE normally are required to carry flood insurance by the federal government.

An open house will be held on Thursday, April 27, 2006, from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the first floor boardroom of the Development Center, 809 North Broadway, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Staff from the Department of Public Works and Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District will be available to answer your questions. Upon conclusion of the open house, the City Plan Commission will hold a public hearing at 4:00 p.m. in the same room. Interested parties will be offered an opportunity to express their views on the proposal prior to consideration by the City Plan Commission and Common Council. Your attendance and comments at this meeting are invited so that a complete examination of all aspects of the proposal can be made.

Please note that in some cases only a survey of your property can accurately determine if your property is located within the 100-year flood plain boundary. NOTES

Floodway widths in some areas may be too narrow to show to scale. Refer to Floodway Data table where floodway width is shown at 1/20 inch.

Corporate limits shown are current as of the date of this map. The user should contact appropriate community officials to determine if corporate limits have changed subsequent to the issuance of this map.

This map may incorporate approximate boundaries of Coastal Boundaries Resource System Units and / or Otherwise Protected Areas established under the Coastal Barrier Improvement Act of 1990 (PL 101-591).
