If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines: Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

This report is written by Police Officer David NOVAK, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 04/09/07, applicant received a citation for Building Code Violations at 2651 N 21st Street.

2. On 04/29/07 at 1:10 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3530 W Silver Spring for a Theft complaint. Officers spoke to the bartender, Kevin Culver, who stated at approximately 12:20 am, two males and two females entered the tavern and were asked for ID. The males became upset, reached behind the bar and removed four bottles of alcohol. The four subjects then left the tavern with the bottles of liquor. The area was checked for these suspects but police were unable to locate anyone matching the descriptions. A report was filed.

3. On 06/17/07 at 2:30 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3530 W Silver Spring for a Shooting complaint. Officers found a male patron who was shot inside the tavern after having an argument with another patron earlier that night. The suspect fled the scene before police arrived.

4. On 06/18/07 at 11:09 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3530 W Silver Spring for an Armed Robbery complaint. Officers spoke to the bartender Kevin Culver who stated an unknown male entered the tavern, implied he had a gun, and stole a bottle of liquor. Officers observed video cameras on the premises but were told they were not taping. Attempts to make contact with licensee, Terry Heinemeier, were unsuccessful. A report was filed.

5. On 10/03/07 at 1:23 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3530 W Silver Spring for a Fight complaint. Investigation found that an unknown male was behind the bar and was asked to leave by a security guard, identified only as Schultz. This subject and several other males then jumped on Schultz punching him in the face. Schultz stated he did not know who was punching him. Officers also interviewed the bartender Elsie Lindert who stated she did not notice anything until after the fight broke out. Lindert stated the subjects who were fighting then left the tavern. Police attempted to contact the licensee, Terry Heinemeier, who was not home but officers left a voicemail message with instructions to contact the officers. The owner never called back. Police were told that the surveillance system in the tavern was not functional.

6. On 12/05/07 at 5:54 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3530 W Silver Spring for an Armed Robbery complaint. Police spoke to Heidi Meyer who works for the Silver Spring Tap. Meyer stated three armed suspects approached her while she was in her auto and forced her to open the side door to the tavern. In there, she was told to give them the money from the till. Meyer stated the suspects then demanded money from the safe located in the back room. Meyer told them she didn't have the combination and the suspects pushed her into the back room attempting to lock her in. The actors fled out of the bar in an unknown direction. No injuries were reported.

The suspect was cited for battery.

17. On 07/01/12 at 1:48 am, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 3530 W Silver Spring Drive. The bartender Kevin Culver did not have his bartender's license on his person, however, it was on the premise in a locker. Also observed was an expired PEP license for the games that the property had. Culver stated he did not know how to turn them off and chose to close the bar.

18. On 07/29/12 at 1:33 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3530 W Silver Spring for a Trouble With Subject complaint. Investigation revealed a subject was inside the bar refusing to leave. Police arrived and escorted the patron out. A wanted check revealed the subject had a warrant and was also found to be in possession of marijuana. The subject was arrested and conveyed to the station for processing.

19. On 09/04/12 at 12:21 am, Milwaukee police were in the area of the 3500 block of W Silver Spring when officers heard numerous shots fired. A subject who was found lying on the ground in front of 3530 W Silver Spring flagged officers down and stated that an actor who fired the shots fled in an auto that drove E/B on Silver Spring fired numerous shots. The auto, along with the occupants, was found shortly after. One subject resisted police arrest and was found to be in a possession of a gun. An arrest was made and reports filed.

20. On 09/08/12 at 12:15 am, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 3530 W Silver Spring. No violations were observed and police obtained surveillance film from a shot's fired complaint that occurred on 09/04/12.

27. On 09/19/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at 3530 West Silver Spring Drive (Silver Spring Tap). Investigation revealed there was an altercation inside the business between two patrons. One of the combatants involved received 11 stitches as a result of this incident. The other combatant was arrested. Milwaukee police incident report # 152620024 filed.

28. On 04/27/2016 at 1:35am officers were dispatched to Silver Spring Tap, 3530 W. Silver Spring Dr, for a battery complaint. The victim, Julie WAPP, stated she is employed by the bar as a bartender but was in the bar drinking as a patron. She stated she was thrown to the ground by security. She admitted she was intoxicated but did not deserve to be treated like that. The officers interviewed security, Shawn PERRON, who stated WAPP was intoxicated and causing a disturbance in the bar. He gave her several warnings to stop her actions. When she turned at him in a threatening manor he grabbed her by the arms and escorted her out the door. He stated he did not push her to the ground. The officer viewed the video which confirmed PERRON's story.
29. On 05/14/2016 at 10:58pm officers were dispatched to Silver Spring Tap, 3530 W. Silver Spring Dr, for a shots fired complaint. The officers interviewed security, Shawn PERRON, who stated he had to kick out a regular customer, "Fred". This subject often causes trouble and is frequently kicked out. "Fred" snuck back in after being kicked out. As PERRON escorted him out the door he saw Fred reaching under his shirt on the right side. He pushed Fred outside and locked the door. He then heard a gunshot and ran to call 911. The officers were able to identify Fred as Frederick JONES. On 05/15/2016 at 12:39am a call of a shooting came in at 2002 W. Stark St where the officers located JONES. JONES stated he was outside the bar smoking a cigarette when a subject fired three shots. He went inside and a subject told him he was bleeding from the leg. He went to the bathroom and saw he had been shot in the leg. JONES went home and called the police.
30. On 06/20/2016 there was a meeting at District Four regarding Silver Spring Tap, 3530 W. Silver Spring Dr. The applicant stated he had unarmed security everyday starting at 10pm and has interior cameras and requested suggestions for other measures to stop problems in the bar. The officers recommended exterior cameras, "No Loitering" signs and to wand all patrons that come in the bar.
31. On 08/07/2016 officers were dispatched to Silver Spring Tap, 3530 W. Silver Spring Dr, for a fight complaint. The caller, Karyn SCHWARTZ, was the bartender. She stated a subject was in the bar pan handling from customers. She asked him to leave and he began throwing customers drinks on the floor. Outside he threw the cigarette receptacles at the windows. The subject was gone when the officer arrived. The applicant came to the business while the officers were there and was notified in person.

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PA-33E Narrative

This License Premise Report is written by P.O. Ralph MCCLAIN, assigned to District Four, Squad 4365, Late Shift. On Wednesday, April 27, 2016, at 1:32 am, my partner, P.O. Martinez MOORE and I were dispatched to a Battery complaint at 3530 W. Silver Spring Dr, Silver Spring Tap. Upon arrival, I spoke with the complainant, Julie N. WAPP, w/f, 10-06-75, who is employed as a bartender at Silver Spring Tap. WAPP, who was standing out in front of the bar, stated that security at the bar threw her to the floor. WAPP admitted that she was intoxicated, but that she did not deserve to get treated that way. I went inside the bar and spoke with the security for the bar, Shawn J. PERRON, w/m, 02-11-78. PERRON stated that WAPP, who was slurring her words, was going around the bar to where various patrons were seated and started getting "all in their face". PERRON said WAPP was making statements such as "I work at this fucking bar" and "The security isn't going to do a fucking thing to me or I'll fuck him up".

PERRON stated he told WAPP to stop antagonizing the patrons. He stated WAPP was very belligerent and loud but indicated that that's par for the course when working in a bar so he did not call the police (also she was an employee).. PERRON stated what made him escort WAPP out the bar was when she loudly said to him "Fuck you, I'm going to fuck you up". PERRON stated WAPP said this to him after she was told numerous times to stop bothering the patrons. PERRON stated WAPP turned towards him in a threatening manner, which he perceived as a threat towards his person. PERRON stated he grabbed WAPP by both arms and escorted her out the front door of the bar. PERRON stated that he never threw WAPP to the floor. (this statement was backed up by other patrons and the bartender that was working that morning).

PERRON invited this officer to view the video of this incident. I viewed the video of this incident which shows WAPP going around to different tables in the bar, leaning over the tables and yelling something to the patrons. At 1:08:11 am, on the above date, I observed WAPP walk slightly out of the frame of the camera then reappear at a table on the northwest side of the bar. WAPP said something to PERRON and turned towards him. PERRON, who is behind WAPP, grabbed her by both arms and walks her out the front entrance, closing and locking the door behind her. The video never shows PERRON throwing WAPP to the floor. PERRON stated that WAPP then banged on the front door and front windows of the bar. As noted above, WAPP is an employee of the bar and due to the fact that she was intoxicated, officers on scene did not allow her to enter her vehicle and drive home. WAPP allowed officers to convey her to her residence.

Occupancy is 50 and it should be noted that the establishment was under the capacity. A check of Silver Spring Tap's license revealed that it was up to date and in plain view behind the bar. There were no violations observed while officers were on scene.

PA-33E Narrative

On Sunday 08/07/16 at 4:11pm Squad 4241 (PO's Cary DOYNE / Ngeung YANG) responded to 3530 W Silver Spring Dr (Silver Spring Dr) for a Fight complaint. Officers interviewed bartender / caller Karyn A. SCHWARTZ who stated the suspect came in to the tavern panhandling customers for cigarettes. SCHWARTZ advised the suspect he was not welcome and instructed him to leave. The suspect became upset and began throwing customers drinks on the floor. The suspect then left out the front door. Once outside, the suspect began throwing the cigarette recepticals at the front windows of the tavern. The suspect left the area before Police arrived.

SCHWARTZ described the suspect as a black male, 24 to 25yrs old, 5'03 to 5'04" tall, shoulder length braided hair, wearing a white polo style shirt with red stripes and blue jeans. SCHWARTZ stated she has observed the suspect in the neighborhood panhandling and believes he has a mental illness.

Class D Tavern licensee Terry L. HEINEMEIER arrived while Officers interviewed SCHWARTZ. I notified HEINEMEIER in person of this incident at this time.

This License Premise report is written by P.O Ralph MCCLAIN

On Saturday, May 14, 2016, at approximately 10:58 p.m. squad. 4420 (P.O. Kurt DANIEL and P.O. Ryan FIDLIN) were dispatched to a Shots Fired complaint at the Silver Spring Tavern, 3530 W. Silver Spring Dr, located in the city and county of Milwaukee.

Upon arrival, P.O. FIDLIN spoke to the caller, later identified as Shawn J. PERRON (W/M, 02/11/78). P.O. Mohammad and secured the scene.

P.O. FIDLIN advised PERRON the Criminal Investigation Bureau would be responding and he would be speaking to a detective.

Squad. 9358, Detective LESNEIWSKI was dispatched and took over the scene.

PERRON stated that on 5-14-15 he started his shift at Silver Spring Tap at 10:00pm. PERRON stated that when he walked into work he was informed by the bartender that a regular customer, Fred (later identified as Frederick D. JONES, B/M, 1-28-1979), needed to be kicked out. PERRON stated that Fred has been coming to the bar for a couple years and he has had numerous encounters with him. PERRON stated that about every six months Fred will act out and will be kicked out of the bar. PERRON stated that Fred will come back to the bar a few weeks later and apologizes for his behavior. PERRON stated that Fred will act out and will try to grab at him or be aggressive towards him. PERRON stated he told Fred that he had to leave and he became boisterous and did not want to leave. PERRON stated that Fred eventually left the bar.

Once Fred was outside he began banging on the exterior windows of the bar yelling that he wanted to come back in. PERRON stated that the bar was quiet for a while and a group of subjects walked into the bar. PERRON stated that once the group was in the bar he saw that Fred was one of the people that walked into the bar. PERRON stated that he was walking around the bar and PERRON was asking him to leave. PERRON stated that he would open the door for Fred and tell him to leave.

PERRON stated that when Fred began to walk out of the bar after being asked numerous times he saw Fred lifting his shirt and reaching for something on the right side of his body. PERRON stated he closed the front door of the bar and locked the door to prevent Fred from walking back in. PERRON stated a short time later he heard one gun shot outside the front door of the bar. PERRON stated he ran away from the door and then called 911. PERRON stated he assumed that the subject firing the gun outside was Fred. PERRON described Fred as-

B/M, 6'02"-6'03", 200lbs, 30-35yoa, medium complexion, muscular build, short hair, goatee, grey sweatshirt with white t-shirt under, blue jeans

PERRON stated that he never saw Fred with a gun. PERRON stated he was focused on Fred's hands while he was trying to get him out of the bar since he has attempted to come after him in the past. I had a booking photo of Frederick JONES, B/M, 1-28-1979, with me and showed the photo to PERRON and he identified JONES as the subject he was referring to as Fred in this incident.

Later on Sunday, May 15, 2016, at approximately 12:39am, PO James NOWAK, Squad 4340, was dispatched to a Shooting Complaint at the address of 2002 W. Stark St., which is located in the City and County of Milwaukee.

Upon arrival PO NOWAK spoke to the victim's father identified as Van JONES Jr. (M/B, 04-08-1943) who stated he was not aware of anyone being shot at the listed location. PO NOWAK then proceeded to come inside the residence to check for a victim, which he then located Frederick D. JONES (M/B, 01-28-1979) in the kitchen. FREDERICK stated he was shot in the right leg in the thigh above the kneecap.

FREDERICK stated at approximately 10:30pm on yesterdays date (05-14-2016) he was at Silver Spring Tap (3530 W. Silver Spring Dr.). FREDERICK stated he was outside of the bar smoking a cigarette when he heard people begin to argue. FREDERICK stated this happens at the bar a lot so he did not pay any attention to the argument.

FREDERICK then stated he heard three shots and decided to walk back inside the bar. At this time another subject stated to him "you're bleeding". FREDERICK then stated he went into the bathroom and noticed that he was shot in the right leg.

FREDERICK then stated to PO NOWAK that he then drove home and called 911.

FREDERICK stated he did not see who shot him nor shot any firearms.

During this interview PO NOWAK observed FREDERICK as being highly intoxicated.

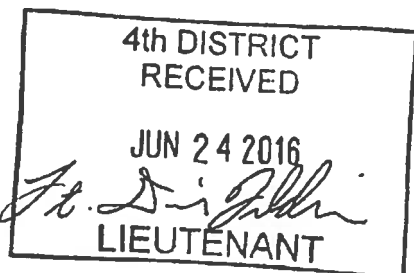

I observed multiple tables which had cases of alcohol (beer) on almost every table. I also observed live entertainment (female singer) on the stage. These violations were caught on my body camera. The event also had security. We then left the building and observed from outside. The event did not clear out until approximately 11-11:30pm.

This report is typed by Sergeant Steve STELTER of District 4 early shift. On Saturday April 15th, 2017, I responded to the Phongasvan Asian Market, located at 6300 N. 76th Street to conduct a license premis check. I received infromation from the District 4 Community Liason Officers, Tracey GENNESSE and Carrie RESNIK that there was going to be a large gathering at the market with live music and possibly alcohol being served.

Upon arrival I was met by Plor YANG, a/f, 12/15/1985 who identified herself as the manager of the market and the daughter of one of the owners, Pai YANG. Pai YANG was on scene during this license premis check. I asked Plor YAN G if there was a permit for the live music show that was taking place in the large room on the East side of the building. She stated she did and a copy of it was posted on the main entrance door where I entered the building. She accompanied me to the main door and pointed to the door but there was no permit posted there. I advised her there was no permit posted on the door and she stated "someone must have torn it off the door." I asked her if she had another copy of the permit, but she was unable to provide me with one.

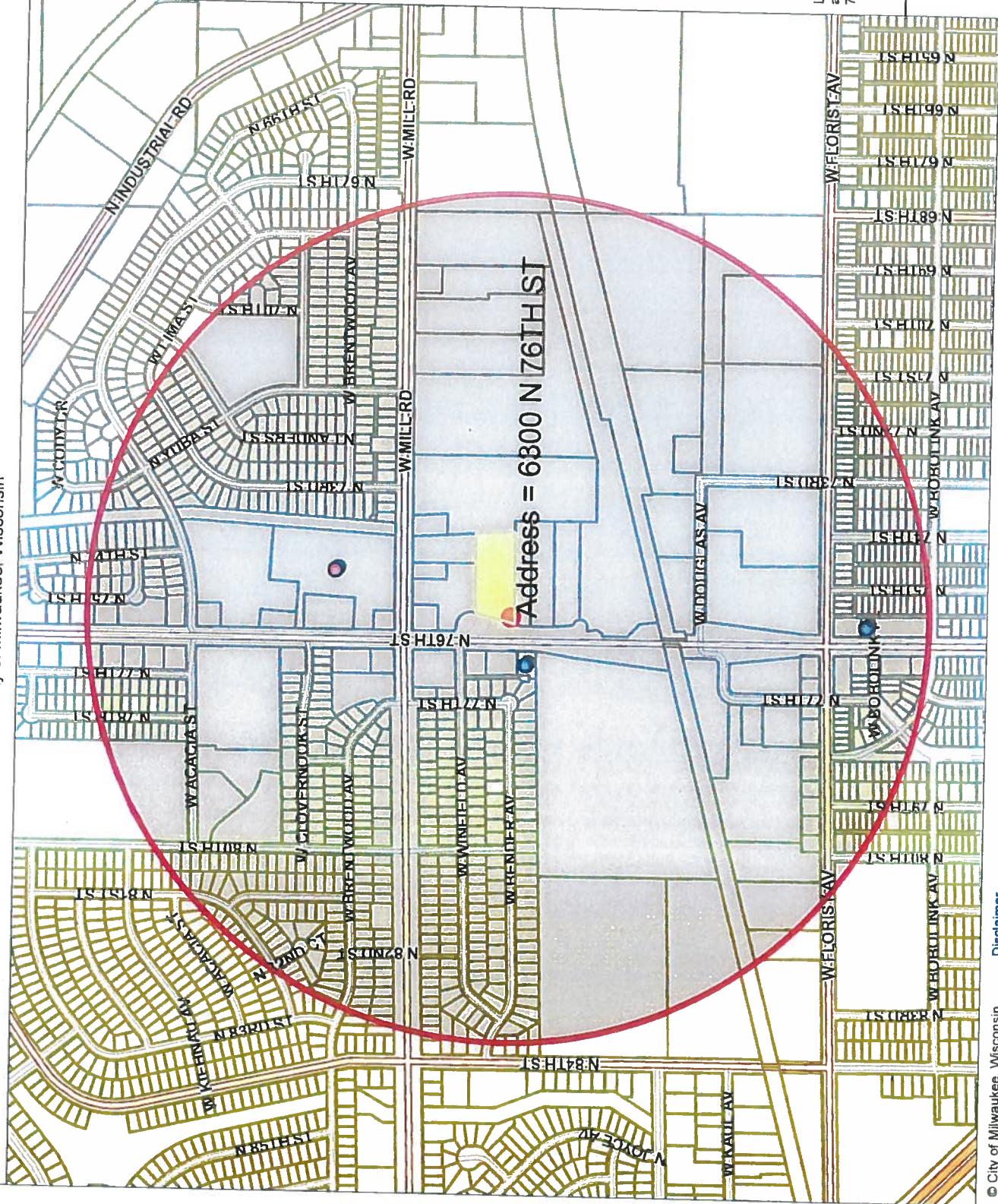

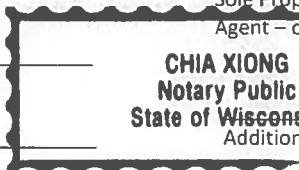

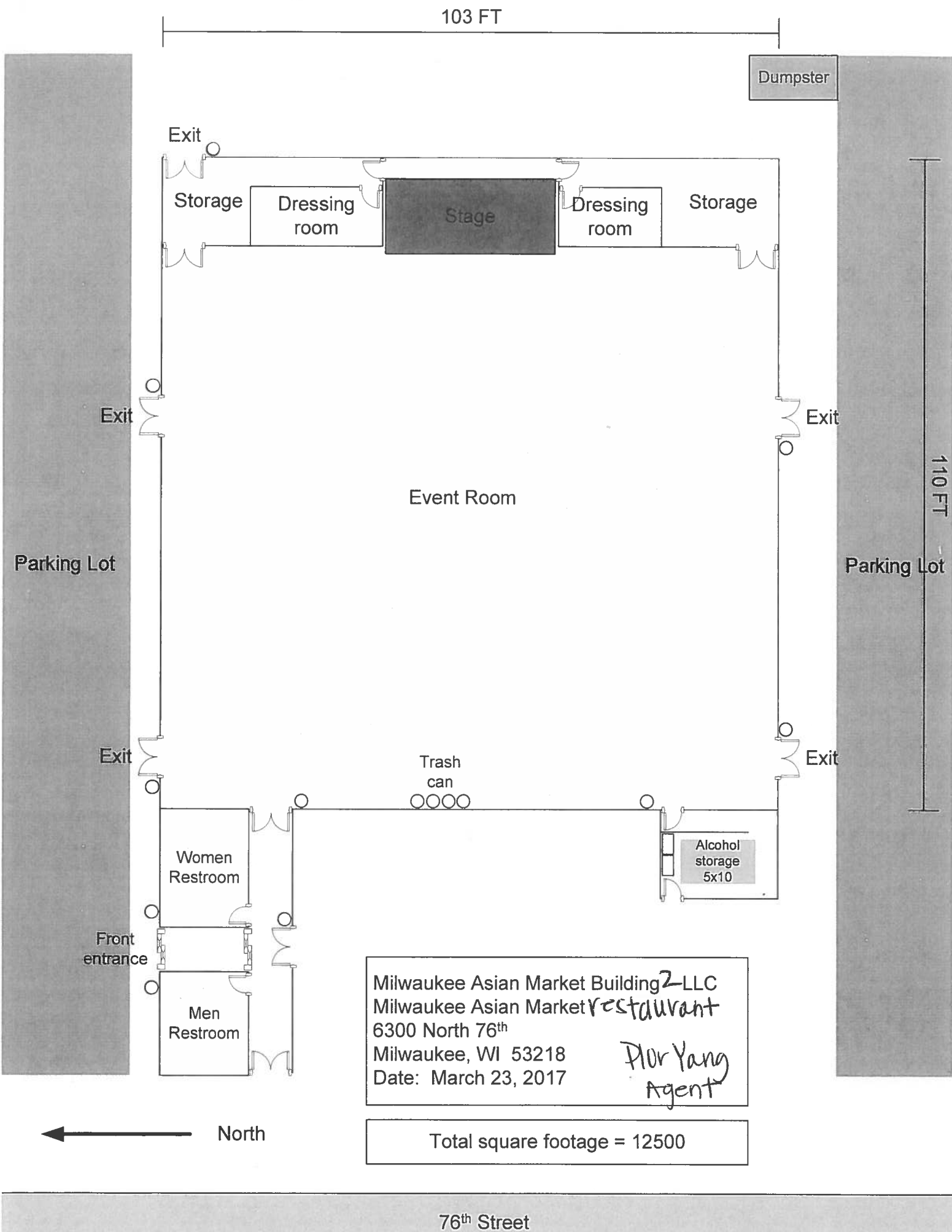
