SUMMARY

SIR:

This report was written by Lieutenant of Detectives David R. BRUESS, of the Internal Affairs Division/Criminal Investigation Unit (IAD/CIU), day shift.

ALLEGATION:

The complainant, Kamallah BRELOVE, states that Officer MARLOCK kicked him after an arrest on 02-16-99.

INVESTIGATION:

In an interview with Det. Ronald HARDEN, BRELOVE stated that he was arrested in his home on 02-16-99. The officers refused to tell BRELOVE why he was arrested, so he stated he refused to get in the squad car. A Black male officer pushed him by the throat into the car while another officer, later identified as Officer MARLOCK, kicked him several times in the shin.

Officer MARLOCK was interviewed and he denied kicking BRELOVE. BRELOVE was uncooperative during the arrest but no officers mistreated BRELOVE in any way. The Black officer, Officer Terrence GORDON (PR#63228, District 3, late power shift), was interviewed. Officer GORDON stated that BRELOVE resisted going into the squad so he pushed BRELOVE in by the shoulders. Officer GORDON denied seeing any officers kick BRELOVE.

Other officers at the scene, as well as BRELOVE'S family members, were interviewed. No one saw officers kick BRELOVE. All reported that BRELOVE was uncooperative with the officers.

Assistant District Attorney Stephanie ROTHSTEIN reviewed the case on 05-13-99, BRELOVE was ordered in for the review but he failed to appear. District Attorney ROTHSTEIN declined to issue charges, as the evidence was insufficient.

CONCLUSION:

Investigation by the Criminal Investigation Unit revealed that officers arrested Kamallah BRELOVE in his home, for a Disorderly Conduct which had occurred earlier at another home. BRELOVE was very uncooperative with officers and refused to enter the squad car. BRELOVE stated that when officers pushed him into the car, Officer MARLOCK kicked him several times in the shin. Officer MARLOCK was interviewed and he denied kicking BRELOVE. All the other officers and BRELOVE'S family members were interviewed but none reported seeing anyone kick BRELOVE. This case was reviewed by District Attorney ROTHSTEIN who declined to issue charges. This case will be cleared as warrant refused.
