P R O C E E D I N G S

(NOTE: All City Personnel Were Sworn Under Oath Prior to These Proceedings.)

CHAIRMAN PAWLINSKI: We're going to skip ahead. We're going to skip to Mike De Sautel, who is the agent for M.R. Entertainment, Incorporated, Class "B" tavern and cabaret renewal for Daddios at 4177 South Howell Avenue. Mr. Arena is here representing Mr. De Sautel?

MR. ARENA: That's correct.

CHAIRMAN PAWLINSKI: What would you like to do?

MR. ARENA: As soon as I was informed of this matter being scheduled today, I contacted the alderman's office and discussed the notion of adjourning the matter because there is a pending sale.

A contract -- contingency in that contract is that the new owner obtain appropriate license for the sale of liquor, and as I've been made aware, that should be occurring -- on April 29th it should be before the committee, so we're asking that this matter be moved to April 29th.

At that time the new applicant's application will be considered, hopefully granted, and would render the necessity of any further hearing for

1 Mr. De Sautel not necessary.

2 CHAIRMAN PAWLINSKI: For the record,  
3 Mr. De Sautel has entered into a contract with another  
4 individual who is looking to purchase the property.  
5 This individual's name is Mike Marshall. He's meeting  
6 with me tonight, in fact, at six p.m., and the  
7 neighbors of the residential neighborhood surrounding  
8 Daddios -- three of the neighbors are here this  
9 afternoon to watch and monitor the events of this  
10 committee, so I'll be conducting a meeting tonight,  
11 introducing them to the prospective new owner, and all  
12 those matters will be taken care of, and the sale  
13 should commence at the --

14 ALDERMAN BOHL: Should I move to adjourn?

15 CHAIRMAN PAWLINSKI: The motion by Alderman  
16 Bohl is to adjourn the matter for Michael De Sautel.

17 ALDERWOMAN CAMERON: To when?

18 CHAIRMAN PAWLINSKI: Potentially never.

19 MR. ARENA: To April 29th, so it remains on  
20 the calendar, so to speak.

21 MR. COPELAND: For clarification, are we  
22 adjourning the application before us to the 29th or  
23 just adjourning?

24 CHAIRMAN PAWLINSKI: We're adjourning it  
25 today. It's possible that Mr. De Sautel will not be

1 appearing before the committee at any period, as long  
2 as the standards of the neighborhood as well as the  
3 application meets the criteria of the licensing.  
4 Mr. Marshall will be before us at the next cycle, so  
5 the motion would be simply to adjourn.

6 ALDERWOMAN CAMERON: Mr. Chair, would the  
7 motion -- I'm not questioning your ability in how you  
8 conduct your business, but I'm just saying wouldn't it  
9 be proper to hold this until April 29th of this month  
10 and place this particular item on file?

11 CHAIRMAN PAWLINSKI: I think it's a horse  
12 apiece.

13 MR. ARENA: It's the same thing.

14 ALDERWOMAN CAMERON: I never heard the word  
15 adjourned, so --

16 MR. COPELAND: Correction. That would be  
17 April 30th.

18 CHAIRMAN PAWLINSKI: April 30th, which is --  
19 You're asking for an adjournment, which -- We didn't  
20 hold it. We're not doing anything with it. We're  
21 simply setting it aside.

22 MR. ARENA: That's correct.

23 CHAIRMAN PAWLINSKI: The motion from  
24 Alderman Bohl is to adjourn. Any objection? Hearing  
25 none, so ordered. Mr. Arena, I hope I never see you

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again on this matter.

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
