In August 1950's the home has served as a rooming house  
Cedar Heights Conservation area preliminary observations under near the asphalt siding, this building retains many of its historic design features. By restoring the original exterior features and returning the home to its double house configuration, it will become an invaluable (re)addition to the Cedar Heights Conservation area

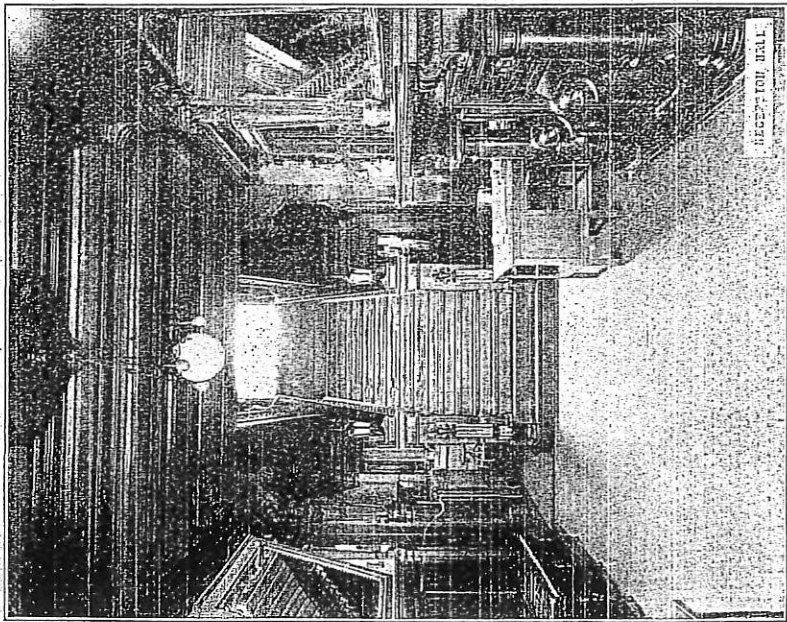
### A BAPTIST HOSPITAL

Patients of practically every religious faith in the community have received its ministrations. It is chartered as a no-stock, non-profit corporation under the laws of Wisconsin.



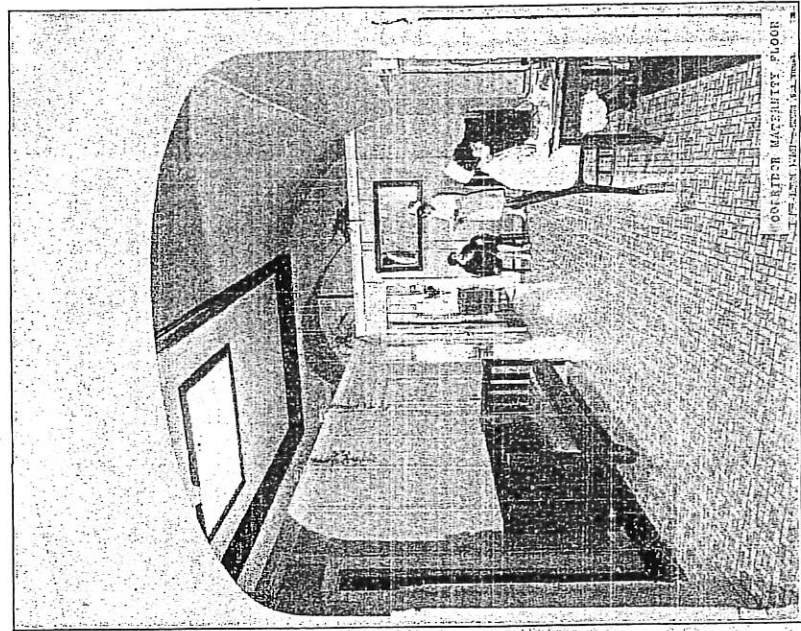
### THE ROGER WILLIAMS HOSPITAL

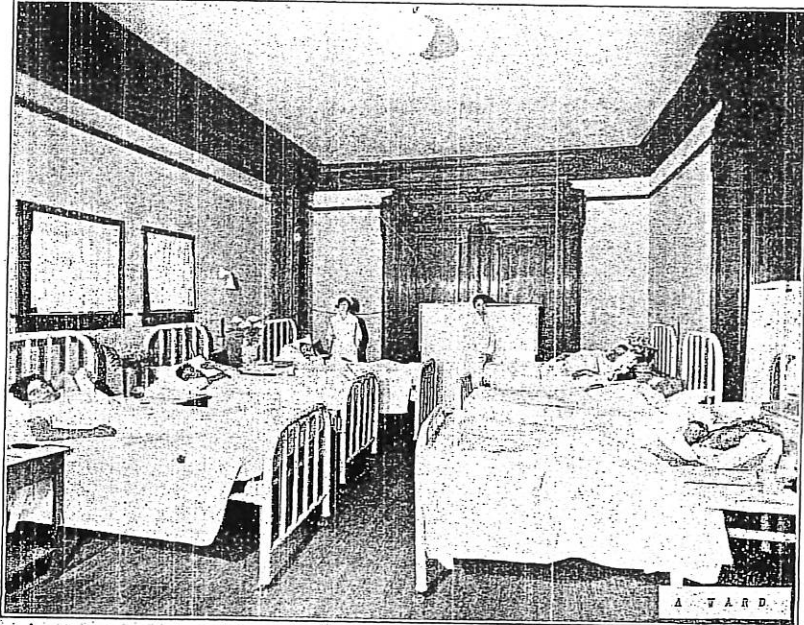
### THE ROGER WILLIAMS HOSPITAL

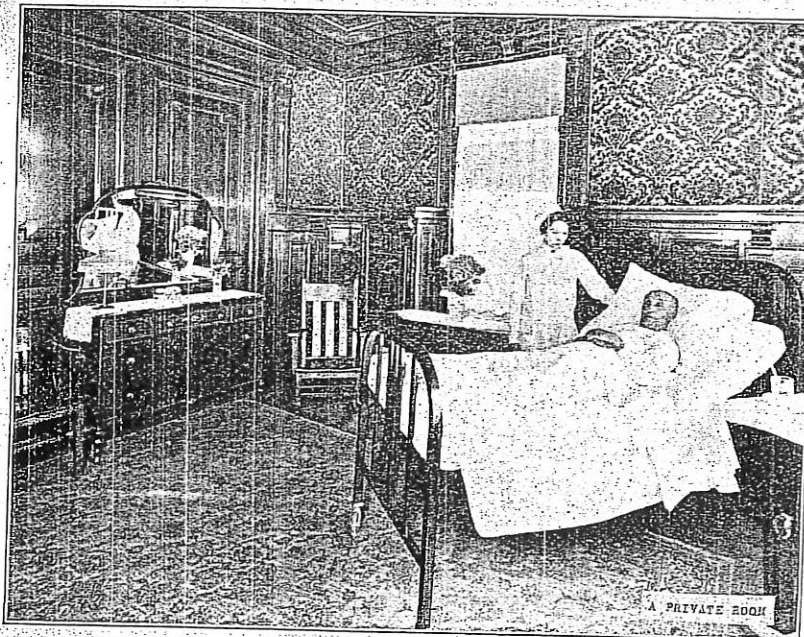


### A HUMANITARIAN ENTERPRISE

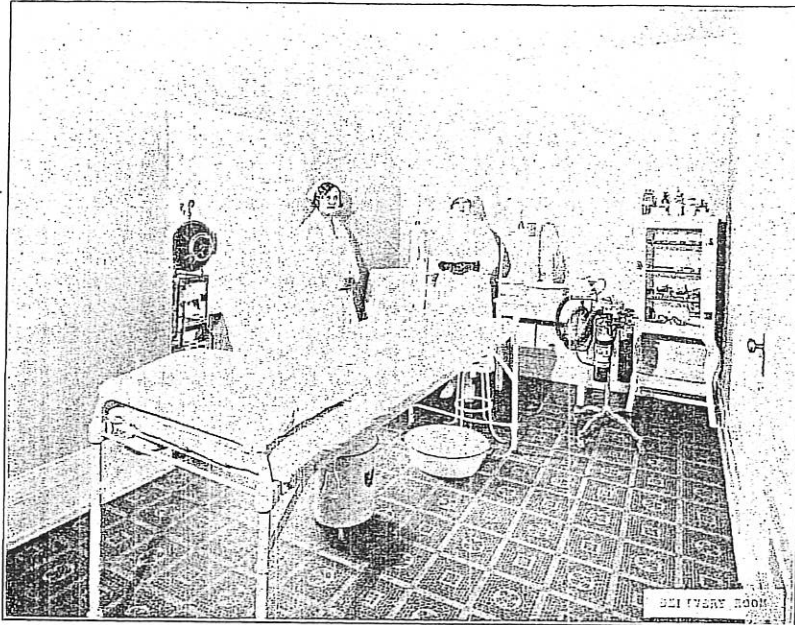

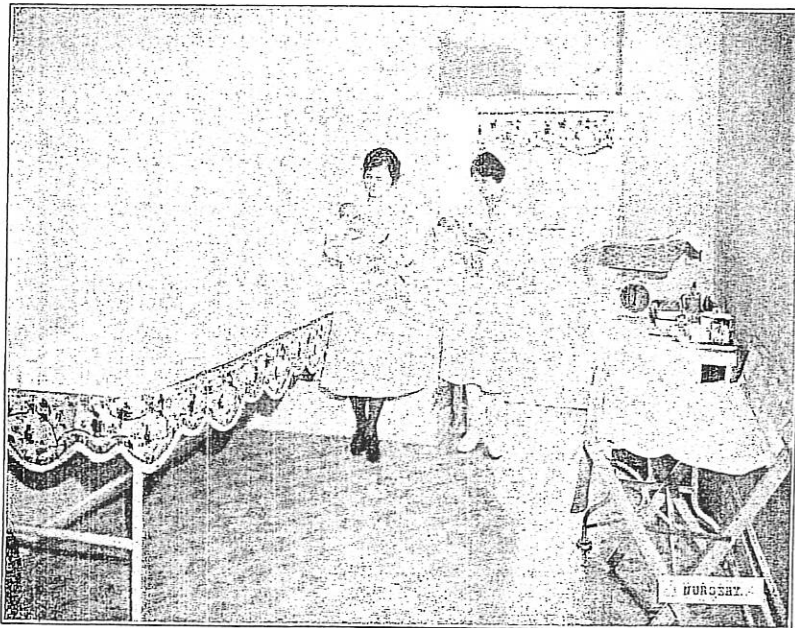

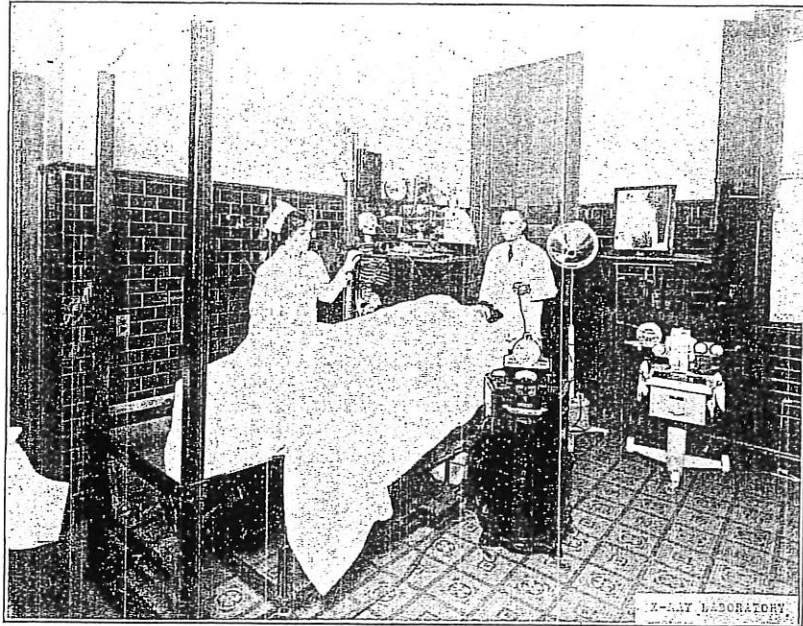


### THE MATERNITY
