The University of Wisconsin Milwaukee Employment and Training Institute (UWM-ETI) assessed the program's first three years of operations in May of 2010 and highlighted the 1) the consistently high direct service success rate; 2) increasingly complex legal issues of the cases the Center processes; and 3) the strength of the relationship between a valid driver's license and income. In addition, the Center did a comprehensive internal study of license retention, which must be done manually to analyze various data, including when clients were resuspended/re-revoked, if at all, and the reason(s) for re-suspension/re-revocation, which revealed that an astounding 62% of clients retain their valid licenses for a year or longer.
