Resolution congratulating Milwaukee Police District 7 on the best crime year in ten years.

WHEREAS,

MILWAUKEE POLICE DISTRICT 7

was congratulated for the best crime drop in 10 years; and

WHEREAS, *Milwaukee Police District 7, located at 3626 W. Fond Du Lac Ave., has had the best crime drop in 10 years due to the efforts of its officers and their participation in offering information and resources such as the Block Watch, burglary warnings, chronic nuisance information, neighborhood clean-up and safety tips to build awareness and crime prevention skills: and*

WHEREAS, *Milwaukee Police District 7 has seen a crime drop from 2016 to 2017 of 20% in rape and 12% in robbery; and*

WHEREAS, *Milwaukee Police District 7 has also seen a drop from 2016 to 2017 of 14% in burglary related crime, 23% in auto theft and 14% in general theft; and*

WHEREAS, *Milwaukee Police District 7 has seen a drop in property crime by 16% as well as an overall 11% drop in part I crimes from 2016-2017, the largest drop made in 10 years; now, therefore, be it*

RESOLVED, *That the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee herewith recognizes Milwaukee Police District 7 on their commitment to safety in the community, thanks its members for their many valuable and commendable contributions to the community, and wishes them continued success; and, be it*
