

The general public is invited to attend the National Lao-Hmong Recognition Day celebration on Saturday, July 23rd, 2005 at Timmerman Airfield in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The day long event will start at 10AM, and include a special recognition of the Lao-Hmong Veterans of the Vietnam War, and their children who are U.S. soldiers today, fighting in the war against terrorism.

In 1995 the Congress of the United States proclaimed July 22nd of each year as a federally sanctioned "National Lao-Hmong Recognition Day" in honor of the Lao-Hmong veterans of the Special Guerilla Units (SGU) and their leadership, for their loyal service, personal sacrifice, and valiant support of American Armed Forces in Laos during the Vietnam War.

Included in this special day of recognition will be cultural activities, music, food, and wares, with an Air Salute at 2PM. The Air Salute, which will honor the Lao-Hmong Veterans, America's strongest war-time allies, will include over 20 Vietnam era air craft and helicopters. In honor of today's Lao-Hmong soldier, a fly-over of F-16s will be included. After the Air Salute, the Vietnam era air craft will land at the air field for photo opportunities and conversation with the pilots of the T-28 war planes.

Please join us for this special day of celebration, pride, and honor. Join us and make new friends. Join us to learn about our history and share in our culture.

The Lao-Hmong American Coalition hopes that this unique event will aid in promoting a better understanding of our culture among all people, and enhance the mutual respect already shared between the Lao-Hmong community and the public in general.


