Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The Personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP) is a federal initiative to help young people avoid teen pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections. These formula grants are given directly to the state agency that administers the program. The State of Wisconsin – DHFS- Division of Public Health through the Medical College of WI, is sub-contracting with the City of Milwaukee Health Department to expand the Plain Talk Milwaukee Initiative's current focus on reducing adolescent risk through training parents and other influence adults, to serving youth 11-19. The program is will address several other issues to help prepare youth for adulthood including healthy relationships, financial literacy, parent-child communication, and educational and career success.

2. Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

The City of MHD has a goal to reduce the birth rate to teens by 46% to a rate of 30 births per thousand teens 15-17 years by 2015.

This renewed contract will provide support for community-based teen pregnancy prevention efforts and also provide outreach support to family planning services provided at MHD Health Clinics.

4. Results Measurement/Progress Report (Applies only to Programs):

The activities below contribute to the overall goal of reducing the teen birth rate and incidence of STDs amongst adolescents in Milwaukee. The teen birth rate has steadily declined over the past 10 years while the incidence of STDs remains stubbornly high.

The Goals of the Plain Talk Program are:

- To Reach 20,000 households (including adults and adolescents) through collaboration with Milwaukee Public Schools, door-to-door and community health fair event outreach
- To train 15 Askable Adults (2 or more hours each)
- Train 50 Youth Ambassadors to reach 400 other youth regarding Family Planning Only Services:
- To recruit and train 5 adults who will provide 24 hours of more of volunteer service to the project
- Partner with at least ten community-based agencies to serve their constituent families:
