Subject: Analysis of Village of Greendale, Wisconsin's

Wholesale Water Supply Change Request

This memo is an analysis of the Wholesale Water Supply Change Request from the Village of Greendale, Wisconsin, as required by Resolution File# 080457.

Introduction

The Village of Greendale, Wisconsin, ("Greendale") requests that the Milwaukee Water Works commit to an enhanced level of service, higher than is typically guaranteed to wholesale customers. Greendale requests that the flow rate, or pressure, of water delivered be increased to meet maximum daily and peak-hour demand. This is not a request to increase the volume of water currently provided.

The increased flow rate is expected to reduce Greendale's water storage capacity needs, and save the Village near-term capital costs and long-range maintenance and replacement expenditures. Greendale's existing elevated water storage tank has reached the end of its useful life and needs to be replaced. In addition, increased pressure may allow Greendale to decommission an existing ground storage reservoir and pumping station.

Affordable Housing

Greendale's affordable housing stock is limited to the long-standing Ridgedale Apartments which offers 220 units at below market rates, and 76 of 90 units in the Berkshire-Greendale senior citizen housing development currently under construction at Southridge Mall will be set-asides for low-income residents.

Environmental Impact

No environmental impact is expected to result from this request.

Other

Greendale expects to realize approximated \$2,000,000 in capital, maintenance and replacement costs savings in the near-term and unknown savings in the future as a result of the requested service change, and has signaled the Village may look favorably on an intergovernmental agreement with the City of Milwaukee to share this windfall on some level.

American Community Survey

The Census Bureau's "long form", which in previous censuses was used to collect detailed socioeconomic information, was replaced beginning in 2010 with the Am0erican Community Survey.

Processed survey information provides annual estimates for all states, cities, counties and population groups of 65,000 people or more. For smaller areas, multiple survey years must be combined to obtain statistically reliable estimates. The Census Bureau combines 5 survey years for areas, like Greendale, with populations less than 20,000.
