Artist Profile

A native of Milwaukee, Jerry L. Johnson is also known in the fine arts market as Mutópe J. Johnson. Mutope is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin, Whitewater, from which he received a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree.

Johnson has successfully pursued a career as a marketing communications designer and illustrator. More than 20 years of experience, including positions as a Senior Graphic Illustrator and Advertising Art Director positions. Johnson also has extensive background in T.V. production and broadcast. With strong design and strategic thinking, from conception to completion, has led to his current position as Creative Director with a Milwaukee based advertising and marketing communications company.

Although Johnson is known commercially for his communications design work, he also uses his fine arts background and has re-focused on painting again. Mutópe is fast becoming a fine artist of record, who's works are collected both publicly and privately.

Assessment Work

Focusing on political and social economic positions of African-Americans, Mutópe's current work demonstrates a true understanding of the fine art media and how it can be used to create works of art that speak to the human condition. Capturing the tone of that condition is what inspires me to paint." The exuberant watercolor and watercolor pencil, in varied and strongly patterned backgrounds and the expressive gestures of his characters brings a heightened energy to his current work. The human figure, whether treated as a group portrait or as an individual, remain his favored subjects. His robust figurative paintings provide an important link between the African-American Social Realism period of the mid- to late 20th-century and the African-American contemporary art scene today.
