Resolution expressing condolences to the family and friends of Officer Kendall Corder, who passed from this life on June 29, 2025.

WHEREAS,

KENDALL CORDER

passed from this life from injuries sustained in the line of duty on June 29, 2025, and his funeral service was held on July 11, 2025 at Elmbrook Church in Brookfield, and a police honor procession proceeded to Wisconsin Memorial Park Cemetery for burial; and

WHEREAS, *Officer Kendall Corder was a highly regarded member of the Milwaukee Police Department whose life will be remembered and honored for his sacrifice and his dedication to family, friends, and to the City of Milwaukee; and*

WHEREAS, *Officer Kendall Corder was a six-year veteran of the Milwaukee Police Department, graduating from the Police Academy in June 2019 and serving as a patrol officer in District Two; and*

WHEREAS, *Officer Kendall Corder loved being a Milwaukee police officer, and lived out what it meant to lead with kindness and quiet strength, and he said publicly that the job of police officer is full of purpose, that every day brings something new, and how he hoped young people would one day see themselves stepping into this calling -- to serve and protect, just like he did; and*

WHEREAS, *Officer Kendall Corder was the loving son of Raymond (the late Matrice) Corder. loving grandson of Rozlyne Corder, dear brother of Dashawn and Rayanna Corder and uncle of Rolando Corder, and is further survived by a host of other relatives and friends, his fellow City of Milwaukee Police Officers, and the brotherhood of Police Officers and First Responders nationwide; now, therefore, be it*
