
Proposal for Christian Wahl Bust Relocation to Lake Park

Basis for Request

In fall of 2020, Milwaukee County Parks renamed the park at 4750 N.48th Street from Wahl Park to Harriet Tubman Park. Since this renaming, the Lake Park Friends have spearheaded an effort to relocate the bust of Christian Wahl that is at the Harriet Tubman Park site back to Lake Park, where it had been years ago.

History of Christian Wahl

Christian Wahl was a wealthy businessman often referred to as the father of Milwaukee's public parks because he led most of the planning of the county's park system. Wahl was born in Bavaria in 1829 and moved with his family to a farm 5 miles south of Milwaukee in 1848. Wahl was president of the first City Park Board in the board's first decade. His strong leadership was instrumental in the development of the city's park system and he took a deep personal interest in the completion of Lake Park.



Sculpture Information

Gaeteno Trentanove (Italian, American 1858-1937)

Christian Wahl, a bronze bust 'portrait' sculpture, 1903

32 in tall x 25 in wide x 18 in deep Solid red granite base 72 inches tall Signature inscribed on the rear of the collar with signature and date 1903

Condition: Good. Patina has caused the sculpture to naturally oxidize, and 'green'.







Dedicated July 13, 1903. Relocated 1960. *Christian Wahl* was originally sited in Lake Park, in Milwaukee's East Side in 1903. It was moved to Wahl Park, located in Milwaukee's North Side, in 1960. In September 2020, the Milwaukee County Board changed the name of the park to Harriet Tubman Park in honor of the well-known abolitionist.

The bronze bust of Christian Wahl depicts a kindly balding older gentleman sporting a beard and mustache, and wearing an overcoat, suit and tie. The sculpture sits on a red granite base with an inscription on the back stating: "He gave/ his ripest years and study/ to the parks/ rewarded alive/ by/ grateful remembrance". This inscription is signed There is an inscription on the front of the base that states: In memory of Christian Wahl/ born 1829/ died October 193
