In response to your letter of May 13, 2005 regarding the above entitled tavern premises, please be advised that the undersigned have been authorized to respond on behalf of Mr. Zanotti. Please consider this letter to be a written objection to the report of the Utilities and Licenses Committee pursuant to the directions contained in your May 13, 2005 letter. With regard to Items 1-4 of the Findings of Fact, we believe those items to be correct in their entirety. With regard to Item 5 of the Findings of Fact, we make the following specific responses to each paragraph.

- A. A bartender was cited for the violation mentioned but the applicant, Mr. Zanotti, was not involved or cited in the incident.
- B. Same response as Item A.
- C. The record indicates that the manager on duty at the time received a citation for loud music. The applicant was not cited.
- D. As stated in Item D, all charges in connection with these allegations were refused for prosecution by the City Attorney's office. In all fairness to the applicant, allegations which were not prosecuted should not be considered by the Council for this license renewal. One can assume that the citations were not prosecuted for lack of evidence and/or a failure to prove the allegations.

- E. This incident is currently pending in the Milwaukee Municipal Court System and is set for trial. There is a serious factual dispute as to the allegations in the citation issued in connection with this incident. It is unfair to the applicant that an unresolved and perhaps improper citation affect any decision made by this Council.
- F. See the response to Item E above.

With regard to the Conclusions of Law, we have no dispute with Item 1. With regard to Item 2, we dispute that the entire police report is accepted as true as stated above. If mere allegations of wrongdoing are sufficient to inflict serious monetary harm (a ten (10) day suspension) in connection with the renewal of this license, then the applicant is being denied its due process.

In conclusion, we believe that the renewal application should be granted by the entire Common Council without any suspension. Thank you for your consideration in this regard.
