

- PROJECTED CHANGES (Proposed Ordinance)

- Statutory Authority
 - WI Statute "Noxious Weeds Prohibited"
 - Grants right of entry on property to destroy noxious weeds
 - Milwaukee Code of Ordinances (Section 80-17)
 - Prohibits pollenization of grasses or weeds which cause or produce hay fever
 - Prohibits turf grass and weeds more than 7" height
 - Persons found in violation subject to Special Charges and mowing abatement costs



Weed Code Enforcement Sweeps



- In 2011 Forestry merged Vacant Lot contract inspections and Nuisance Weeds enforcement
- Proactive approach to foreclosure property management
- 83% of violations identified proactively thru sweeps




61% inspections completed 123% violations cited 98% contractor abatements \$276,000 in special fees

DPW Partnerships with Community Based Organization

- Milwaukee Community Services Corp
 - 2013-14 Sidewalk Snow Removal: 650 City-owned improved properties.
- Running Rebels
 - 2013-14 Mowing & Sidewalk Snow Removal: 68 City-owned vacant lots
- Riverworks
 - 2013-14 Debris Removal Contract on City- owned properties.
- Walnut Way
 - Ongoing discussions about contract opportunities
- Contract Mixers
 - Connecting contractors, workforce development partners and CBO's

- Violation Notification and Resolution
 - Written Violation Notice Posted on Properties with Structures (90% of all violations)
 - Property owner given 72 hr. grace period to abate
 - Property inspected 3 days after posting
 - Properties found in violation sent to contractor
 - Vacant Lot Violations Sent to Contractor
 - Violation Resolution Timeframe
 - Homeowner Mowed (1-3 days): \$50 Special Charge
 - Contractor Mowed (5-7 days): Additional \$100 or \$150
 Special Charge, plus cost of mowing



Tall Weed Ordinance (Proposed)

- Requires written notification to Property
 Owners or Occupants for all 1st time violations
- Waives \$50.00 Violation Special Charge for properties abated by property owner within 2 days of notice
- Codifies a 2-day compliance period following posting to avoid \$50.00 Special Charge

Proposed Ordinance Impacts

- \$300,000 Annual Revenue Reduction
- 2-day timeframe to process and mail 200 violation notifications daily
- \$4,600 Mailing costs (not including mail certification)
- .5 FTE Clerical Staff (\$60,000) budget Impact
- Unknown property owner receipt date of notice without return receipt
- Differential delivery timeframe for local versus out of state/country property owners
- Increased Violation Resolution Timeframe for City abatement of 6,000 properties
 - Homeowner Mowed (1-2 days)
 - Contractor Mowed (8-12+ days)
