SUMMARY

The Department of Public Works (DPW) closed 23 formal contracts from July 1 – September 30, 2019. In the third quarter of 2019, 91.3%--or 21 of 23—closed contracts were compliant with Resident Preference Program (RPP) requirements.

Beginning in 2017, all contracts let with a RPP requirement also included a requirement that one quarter of all RPP hours be worked by residents of high-poverty zip codes as identified by the City Clerk's Office. The following zip codes are identified as high-poverty for this reporting period: 53204, 53205, 53206, 53208, 53210, 53212, 53215, 53218 and 53233. A new provision of this program allows each RPP hour from these zip codes in excess of the required amount to be counted as 1.5 hours. DPW closed 10 construction contracts in the third quarter that made use of the provision for high-poverty credit hours. In fact, all but one contract closed in this period that were let in 2017 or later included credit hours for exceeding the required number of RPP hours from those living in high-poverty zip codes. This demonstrates that the contracting community is hiring from Milwaukee's high-poverty neighborhoods.

One of the contracts closed during this period were let without RPP requirements.

HIGHLIGHTS OF QUARTER 2 RPP COMPLIANCE


- 23 contracts closed
- 91.3% of contracts closed during this period were compliant with RPP requirements
- 1 contract let without RPP requirements for specialty work (Floating Islands at Hartung Quarry Park)
- Two contracts closed during this period were noncompliant with RPP requirements
 - One contractor was penalized \$3,177.00 for failing to meet 40% RPP requirement on speed hump installation project
 - One contract failed to meet RPP requirements due to a significant change in contract scope after the project was awarded. DPW waived penalties in this case.




PARTICIPATION BY GENDER



CONCLUSION

DPW contracts meet—and often exceed—RPP requirements. All but two formal contracts closed by DPW during the third quarter of 2019 met RPP requirements. Nearly all closed construction contracts let after 2017 made use of the provision for RPP credit hours by employing RPP-certified workers from high-poverty areas beyond the requirement that 25% of all hours are worked by employees living in

these zip codes (only C545180041 did not make use of credit hours, however, this contract had 93% RPP participation). Contractors are meeting new RPP requirements and are employing RPP participants from high-poverty zip codes to a greater degree than expected.

Overall, the rate of RPP compliance on DPW contracts closed from July 1 – September 30, 2019 is in line with previous reports of the department's compliance with RPP requirements. Non-compliance with RPP requirements is rare. When contractors fail to meet RPP requirements, DPW imposes penalties on contractors unless the contractor is able to provide an acceptable explanation of this shortfall. The Department of Public Works expects that high levels of RPP compliance will continue to be seen as the department and the contractors who work with DPW most often are committed to the success of the Residents Preference Program.
