

AODA Residential is now covered by Medicaid!



- No age requirement
- Clients must be enrolled in a full-benefit Medicaid plan
- Clients must be pursuing recovery from at least one substance

Accessing AODA Residential Treatment



Access thru BHD CARS Community-Based Access Points, BHD CARS Intake Team, or Direct Admission by the AODA Residential Treatment Provider



CCS clients that are unable to access residential SUD treatment through their CCS program may access services through the residential SUD treatment benefit



For members enrolled in an HMO, IRIS, or MCO, residential SUD treatment providers are expected to notify the HMO, IRIS, or MCO of each authorization within 48 hours of the member's admission.



Individual agencies will manage their own waitlists. CARS will only manage a waitlist for uninsured consumers.



What will Medicaid Cover?

- Substance Use Disorder Residential/ASAM level 3.1 low intensity residential (75.14)
 - Rate of reimbursement \$99.84/day
- Substance Use Disorder Residential/ASAM level 3.5 high intensity residential (75.11)
 - Rate of reimbursement \$227.87/day
- The residential SUD treatment benefit is not covered under Children Come First, Care4Kids, Wraparound Milwaukee, IRIS, Family Care, or Family Care Partnership.
 - Members of these programs would access this benefit via fee-for-service Wisconsin Medicaid.



NOT Covered by Medicaid

- Room and Board
 - Milwaukee County Behavioral Health Division will be paying R&B for all Medicaid covered individuals approved for residential.

Authorizations

- 75.14 (low intensity)
 - 6 or more hours of treatment
 - Initial auth 10 days (automatic), then an additional 20, then 30-day increments
- 75.11 (high intensity)
 - 20 or more hours of treatment
 - Initial auth 10 days (automatic), then an additional 20, then 10- day increments
- If transferring from 75.11 to 75.14
 - Considered a new auth, 10 days, then an additional 20, then 30-day increments

Modifiers

- Pregnant/Parenting women's program
 - The "HD" modifier may be used for members who are currently pregnant through 60 days post-partum
- Child/Adolescent program
 - The "HA" modifier may be used for members who are currently under the age of 18.
- Integrated Mental Health and Intellectual Disability/Developmental Disabilities programs
 - The "HI" modifier may be used when a member has a documented intellectual or developmental disability that requires the clinician to significantly adapt the treatment approach to accommodate the member's comprehension and communication limitations.
