5. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

Below is a list of work previously completed to the exterior of the home:

- 1.) New roof put on home and garage. Both were complete tear-offs. Previously, the roof had no decking under the existing shingles. The roof was decked prior to the ice barrier, flashing and new tri-dimensional shingles going on.
- 2.) Aluminum siding which had been torn off the Northeastern corner of the home (rear) prior to purchase, was replaced with new aluminum siding.
- 3.) Vinyl windows on the home that had been damaged and boarded up prior to purchase were either repaired if the damage was not too severe, or replaced if they were.
- 4.) Rotted kitchen windows were removed and replaced with a sliding vinyl window that matched the existing vinyl windows on the home.
- 5.) Wooden decorative windows on the upper level (north and south side of the home) were removed for repair, and will be placed back on the home.
- 6.) Rear door and door frame of home had been destroyed beyond repair prior to purchase. Door was replaced with a safety door and painted.
- 7.) Rotted basement windows were removed from home and replaced with glass-block windows for safety. Glass-block windows each have smaller windows inside of them, that are able to be opened to allow for fresh air in the basement. One of the glass-block windows has venting for clothes dryer exhaust hook-up.
- 8.) Front porch has been sanded to remove the many layers of paint, allowing for the natural wood to shine through. Porch will be sealed with a clear/light deck stain.
- 9.) Lattice at the base of the front porch was painted.
- 10.) Aluminum siding and wood trim on home and wood siding and trim on garage was scraped smooth and repainted.
- 11.) Garage door, previously four different colors, was painted one color uniform with the trim on the home.
- 12.) Broken windows on the garage will be repaired if possible, or replaced if not. The garage access door and frame, which were damaged beyond repair prior to purchase, will be replaced.
- 13.) The missing and/or broken boards on the wooden deck adjacent to the garage was repaired.
- 14.) Missing aluminum gutter down spouts were either repaired or replaced where missing.
- 15.) Lead water line lateral was replaced, allowing for clean and safe drinking water.
- 16.) Yard received both hard and soft landscaping to include; stone work to create flower beds along west (front) and south (side) of the home, as well an area in the front, using stones already present on property. Bushes, flowers and a tree were planted, and the yard was seeded with grass seed.
