



Departmental Budget Appropriation Category






Reduction in staffing budget since investment in electronic case management, on-line services and automation of court services in 2010.



Staffing Update

- The department plans to reduce the use of temporary staff in 2020 through a larger pool of trained regular employees and improved training materials.
- Rather than use alternate judges in 2020, a branch will be closed when an elected judge is unavailable.



Grants

This department receives no grant funding.

Capital Requests

There are no capital funds for the department in the 2020 Budget.

An ongoing capital project to upgrade the Court's automated tracking system and website received a total of \$888,000 in funding in 2015 and 2017. The upgrade is projected for completion in 2019.

Warrant Withdrawal Wednesdays

During these events, judges provide assistance in setting payment plans, payment extensions and alternative options to payment, while removing employment barriers like outstanding warrants and driver's license suspensions.

Two WWW were held in 2018, during which 325 individuals appeared before the Court to address 2,200 cases.


WWWs have been discontinued in 2019 due to questions about long-term efficacy and staffing shortages.

Customer Service

Convenient evening courts were offered on 11 dates in 2018, with 28 sessions scheduled for 490 defendants on 831 cases.

The Municipal Court permits individuals to walk in for unscheduled court appearances.

The Municipal Court also works to ease the burden of fines on financially-distressed individuals. Payments are waived for a first extension and additional 60-90 day extensions may be granted upon partial payments as low as \$20.

MPS Driver's Education

The 2020 Proposed Budget includes \$50,000 for the MPS Driver's Education Special Purpose Account, which will fund driver's education for 161 students. During the 2018-19 school year, 1,655 students were served at 16 locations. 100% of the students passed their temporary permit test and 92% have received their temporary permits. Each student must hold a temporary permit for 6 months prior to taking a road test and obtaining a probationary driver's license. To date, 253 students from the 2018-19 school year have received their probationary driver's license. Another 913 participants are not yet eligible to take the road test until their 6 month waiting period expires.

The classes are offered at Bay View, Bradley Tech, Hamilton, James Madison Academic Campus, Milwaukee High School of the Arts, Milwaukee Marshall, Milwaukee School of Languages, North Division, Obama SCTE, Pulaski, Riverside, Ronald Reagan, Rufus King, South Division, Vincent and Washington.
