File # 061017 is a resolution amending Common Council File # 060498 relating to the application, acceptance, funding and expenditure of a Bioterrorism Focus CRI/Pandemic Flu Grant from the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

## **Background**

- 1. The Cities Readiness Initiative (CRI) is a pilot program to aid cities in increasing capacity to deliver medicines and medical supplies during a large-scale public health emergency such as a bioterrorism attack or a nuclear accident. The Cities Readiness Initiative will:
  - help save lives through timely delivery of medicines and medical supplies during a large-scale public health emergency, and
  - enable cities to deliver medicines and medical supplies to populations within a timeframe that will make an appreciable health difference in the event of a bioterrorism attack.
- 2. The Pandemic Influenza project is a project that requires all local public health departments and tribal jurisdictions to:
  - complete the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
    Pandemic Influenza Local Assessment,
  - complete a Pandemic Influenza Plan,
  - complete a Pandemic Influenza exercise, and
  - continue to build upon public health preparedness outreach and education initiatives.
- 3. This grant is consistent with the Milwaukee Health Department's strategic goal of increasing public health preparedness to respond to emergencies.
- 4. The geographic scope of programming under this grant is the entire Milwaukee Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA).

### **Discussion**

- 1. This proposed award increases the 100% grantor share of \$176,000 by \$342,780 to support a current program.
- 2. The grant period will be 9/1/06 to 8/31/07.
- 3. This is grant supports 3 part time employees, 2 fulltime FTEs, and adds a new 0.5 FTE Health Promotion and Risk Communication Coordinator. The following amended budget is proposed for the current period:

4. The resolution in File #061017 directs that the Positions Ordinance (File # 050457) be amended to provide for the following personnel changes:

Delete: Epidemiologist (Bioterrorism Focus B)

Health Project Coordinator (Bioterrorism Focus CRI)

Public Health Nurse (Bioterrorism Focus CRI)

Add: Epidemiologist (Bioterrorism Focus CRI/Pandemic Flu)

Health Project Coordinator (CRI/Pandemic Flu)

Public Health Nurse (CRI/Pandemic Flu)

Health Promotion and Risk Communication Coordinator

(CRI/Pandemic Flu)

Telecommunications Analyst-Associate (CRI/Pandemic Flu)

5. The resolution further authorizes the City Comptroller to commit \$352,780 grantor share funds, in addition to the \$176,000 already committed, within the Project/Grant Parent of the 2007 Special Revenue-Grant and Aid Projects Fund and to create appropriate Special Revenue Fund-Grant and Aid Project/Grant and Project /Grant levels.

6. The resolution further authorizes the Health Department, consistent with the terms of the grant, to: expend from these budgeted amounts and to enter into subcontracts and leases

# **Fiscal Impact**

1. This proposed additional \$352,780 in non-O&M funding will support continuing activities and essential services. There is no fiscal impact on the tax levy.
